Suspending limitations on conference committee jurisdiction, H.B. No. 2030 (Turner of Tarrant/West)

RESOLUTION

- BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the State of Texas, 87th
- 2 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021, That Senate Rule 12.03 be
- 3 suspended in part as provided by Senate Rule 12.08 to enable the
- 4 conference committee appointed to resolve the differences on House
- 5 Bill 2030 (certain grant programs, scholarships, and initiatives
- 6 administered by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board) to
- 7 consider and take action on the following matters:
- 8 (1) Senate Rule 12.03(4) is suspended to permit the
- 9 committee to add text on a matter not included in either the house
- 10 or senate version of the bill by adding the following SECTIONS to
- 11 the bill:
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 61.9773(a), Education Code, is amended
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 (a) To receive a scholarship under this subchapter, a
- 15 student must enter into an agreement with the board as provided by
- 16 this section. The agreement must require the student to:
- 17 (1) complete:
- (A) one year of ROTC training for each year that
- 19 the student receives the scholarship, up to a maximum requirement
- 20 of four years of ROTC training; or
- 21 (B) [complete] another undergraduate officer
- 22 commissioning program such as the United States Marine Corps
- 23 Platoon Leaders Class;
- 24 (2) graduate not later than six years after the date

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- 1 the student first enrolls in a public or private institution of
- 2 higher education in this state;
- 4 (A) a four-year commitment to be a member of the
- 5 Texas Army National Guard, Texas Air National Guard, Texas State
- 6 Guard, United States Coast Guard, or United States Merchant Marine;
- 7 or
- 8 (B) a contract to serve as a commissioned officer
- 9 in any branch of the armed services of the United States;
- 10 (4) meet the physical examination requirements and all
- 11 other prescreening requirements of the Texas Army National Guard,
- 12 Texas Air National Guard, Texas State Guard, United States Coast
- 13 Guard, or United States Merchant Marine or the branch of the armed
- 14 services with which the student enters into a contract; and
- 15 (5) agree to repay the scholarship if the student:
- 16 (A) fails to maintain satisfactory academic
- 17 progress;
- 18 (B) withdraws from the scholarship program; or
- 19 (C) fails to fulfill a commitment or contract
- 20 described by Subdivision (3).
- 21 SECTION 3. Subchapter FF, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
- 22 amended by adding Section 61.97731 to read as follows:
- Sec. 61.97731. NOTICE REGARDING MINIMUM AND REQUIRED ROTC
- 24 TRAINING. The board shall post on the board's Internet website and
- 25 provide to each student before the student enters into an agreement
- 26 with the board under Section 61.9773 information regarding the
- 27 number of years of ROTC training that each entity described by

- 1 Section 61.9773(a)(3) requires or recommends before entering into a
- 2 commitment or contract described by that subdivision.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 61.9773(a), Education Code, as amended
- 4 by this Act, applies beginning with a Texas Armed Services
- 5 Scholarship awarded for the 2022-2023 academic year. A Texas Armed
- 6 Services Scholarship awarded for an academic year before that
- 7 academic year is governed by the law in effect when the scholarship
- 8 was awarded, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 9 purpose.
- 10 Explanation: This change is necessary to require students who
- 11 receive a scholarship under the Texas Armed Services Scholarship
- 12 Program to complete a certain number of years of ROTC training and
- 13 to require the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board to provide
- 14 notice to those students of certain information regarding ROTC
- 15 training.
- 16 (2) Senate Rule 12.03(4) is suspended to permit the
- 17 committee to add text on a matter not included in either the house
- 18 or senate version of the bill by adding the following SECTION to the
- 19 bill:
- SECTION 4. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
- 21 Subchapter 00 to read as follows:
- 22 <u>SUBCHAPTER OO. TEXAS BRAIN UNIVERSITY RESEARCH INITIATIVE</u>
- Sec. 61.9971. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 24 (1) "Advisory board" means the Texas brain university
- 25 research initiative advisory board.
- 26 (2) "Distinguished researcher" means a researcher who
- 27 <u>is an expert in:</u>

- 1 (A) the causes of and prevention, treatment,
- 2 rehabilitation, and cures for brain-related diseases, syndromes,
- 3 disorders, dysfunction, injuries, developmental issues,
- 4 neurological health issues, mental and behavioral health issues,
- 5 and substance abuse disorders and other addictions; or
- 6 (B) any other area impacting the brain, including
- 7 an area that directly or indirectly impacts or is impacted by the
- 8 brain or brain health, such as the gut microbiome, nutrition, and
- 9 the spinal cord or nervous system.
- 10 (3) "Eligible institution" means a general academic
- 11 teaching institution, a health-related institution, a nonprofit
- 12 research institution, and a private or independent college or
- 13 university located in this state and accredited by a recognized
- 14 accrediting agency. The term includes a historically black college
- 15 or university.
- 16 (4) "Fund" means the Texas brain university research
- 17 initiative fund established under this subchapter.
- 18 (5) "Health-related institution" means:
- 19 (A) a medical and dental unit and any other
- 20 public health science center, public medical school, or public
- 21 dental school established by statute or in accordance with this
- 22 chapter; and
- (B) a private medical, dental, or public health
- 24 college or university located in this state and accredited by a
- 25 recognized accrediting agency.
- Sec. 61.9972. ADMINISTRATION OF INITIATIVE. (a) The Texas
- 27 brain university research initiative is administered by the board.

- 1 (b) From the Texas brain university research initiative
- 2 fund, the board shall award matching grants to assist eligible
- 3 institutions in recruiting distinguished researchers.
- 4 (c) The board may adopt any rules the board considers
- 5 necessary to administer this subchapter.
- 6 Sec. 61.9973. MATCHING GRANTS. (a) An eligible
- 7 institution may apply to the board for a matching grant from the
- 8 fund. The board may only consider grant applications that are
- 9 recommended to the board by the advisory board. If the board
- 10 approves a grant application, the board shall award to the
- 11 applicant institution a grant amount equal to the amount committed
- 12 by the institution for the recruitment of a distinguished
- 13 researcher, except as provided by Subsection (c)(2).
- 14 (b) A grant application must identify the source and amount
- 15 of the eligible institution's matching funds and must demonstrate
- 16 that the proposed use of the grant has the support of the
- 17 institution's president. An applicant eligible institution may
- 18 commit for matching purposes any funds of the institution available
- 19 for that purpose other than appropriated general revenue.
- 20 (c) The board may set one or more deadlines for grant
- 21 applications for each state fiscal year. After fully funding
- 22 approved grant applications received during an application period
- 23 for a state fiscal year, the board may reopen applications for that
- 24 year and:
- 25 (1) award the full amount of matching funds from the
- 26 fund for new applications; or
- 27 (2) approve previously disapproved applications

- 1 submitted before the original application deadline for receipt of a
- 2 reduced grant amount.
- 3 (d) A matching grant received by an eligible institution
- 4 under this subchapter may not be considered as a basis to reduce,
- 5 directly or indirectly, the amount of money otherwise appropriated
- 6 to the institution.
- 7 (e) A matching grant may not be used by an eligible
- 8 institution to recruit a distinguished researcher or other employee
- 9 from:
- 10 <u>(1) another eligible institution; or</u>
- 11 (2) a private or independent institution of higher
- 12 education.
- 13 (f) The board shall require an application and all
- 14 supporting documentation to be submitted to the board
- 15 <u>electronically in the manner prescribed by the board.</u>
- Sec. 61.9974. GRANT AWARD CRITERIA; PRIORITIES. (a) In
- 17 awarding grants, the board shall give priority to proposals that:
- 18 (1) involve the recruitment of distinguished
- 19 researchers, including researchers who study mental and behavioral
- 20 health issues arising from the COVID-19 pandemic; or
- 21 (2) demonstrate a reasonable likelihood of
- 22 contributing substantially to this state's national and global
- 23 <u>economic competitiveness.</u>
- 24 (b) A grant proposal must include a description of the
- 25 <u>distinguished researcher or researchers the grant applicant is</u>
- 26 recruiting and the research field of the distinguished researcher
- 27 or researchers, and may include a sample list of potential

- 1 <u>distinguished researcher targets.</u>
- 2 Sec. 61.9975. TEXAS BRAIN UNIVERSITY RESEARCH INITIATIVE
- 3 FUND. (a) The Texas brain university research initiative fund is a
- 4 <u>dedicated account in the general revenue fund.</u>
- 5 (b) The fund consists of:
- 6 (1) amounts appropriated or otherwise allocated or
- 7 <u>transferred by law to the fund; and</u>
- 8 (2) gifts, grants, and other donations received for
- 9 the fund.
- 10 (c) The fund may be used by the board only for the purposes
- 11 of this subchapter, including for necessary expenses incurred in
- 12 the administration of the fund and this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.9976. CONFIDENTIALITY. Information collected or
- 14 obtained by the board or the advisory board concerning the identity
- 15 of a particular distinguished researcher who is the subject of a
- 16 grant proposal under this subchapter is confidential unless the
- 17 researcher and the applicant eligible institution consent to
- 18 disclosure of the information. The information remains
- 19 confidential until the date, if any, on which the researcher enters
- 20 into an employment relationship with the recruiting institution as
- 21 contemplated in the grant proposal.
- Sec. 61.9977. ADVISORY BOARD. (a) The Texas brain
- 23 university research initiative advisory board is established to
- 24 assist the board with the review and evaluation of applications for
- 25 <u>funding of grant proposals under this subchapter.</u> The advisory
- 26 board shall make recommendations to the board for approval or
- 27 disapproval of those applications.

- 1 (b) The advisory board must be composed of at least nine
- 2 members appointed by the governor. Of the members of the board:
- 3 (1) one-third of the members, as nearly as possible,
- 4 must have a background in finance;
- 5 (2) one-third of the members, as nearly as possible,
- 6 <u>must have an academic background in science, medicine, or brain</u>
- 7 <u>health; and</u>
- 8 (3) one-third of the members, as nearly as possible,
- 9 must be public members.
- (c) Chapter 2110, Government Code, does not apply to the
- 11 size, composition, or duration of the advisory board.
- 12 (d) A member of the advisory board who is or has been
- 13 employed by, is or has been a party to a contract for any purpose
- 14 with, or is a student or former student of an applicant eligible
- 15 <u>institution may not be involved in the review</u>, evaluation, or
- 16 recommendation of a grant proposal made by that institution.
- 17 (e) An advisory board member is not required to be a
- 18 resident of this state.
- 19 (f) Appointments to the advisory board shall be made without
- 20 regard to the race, color, disability, sex, religion, age, or
- 21 <u>national origin of the appointees.</u>
- 22 <u>(g) Members of the advisory board serve without</u>
- 23 compensation but are entitled to reimbursement for actual and
- 24 necessary expenses in attending meetings of the advisory board or
- 25 performing other official duties authorized by the board.
- 26 (h) The advisory board shall develop a research plan to
- 27 foster synergistic investigation into brain health and research by

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- 1 <u>eligible institutions.</u>
- 2 Explanation: This change is necessary to provide for the
- 3 creation of the Texas brain university research initiative.
