IN RE: HB861 by Thierry (Relating to a study and report on the establishment and implementation of a program that provides financial assistance to property owners who offer housing to veterans at risk of homelessness.), **As Introduced**

Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds for HB861, As Introduced : a negative impact of (\$175,000) through the biennium ending August 31, 2023.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would amend code relating to a study and report on the establishment and implantation of a program that provides financial assistance to property owners who offer housing to veterans at risk of homelessness. The bill identifies that the Texas Interagency Council for the Homeless (TICH) is responsible for evaluating the feasibility, methods, funding sources, and costs of establishing and implementing a program that provides financial assistance to property owners who offer housing to veterans at risk of homelessness.

Methodology

Based on information provided by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA), the bill would result in a cost of \$175,000 in General Revenue in fiscal year 2022 associated with professional fees to procure a third party to undertake the required study. The agency has based cost assumptions on a similar housing report and study outsourced by TDHCA.

Technology

There is no anticipated technology impact as a result of implementing this bill.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
