IN RE: HB1097 by Lozano (Relating to the processing and sale of kratom and kratom products; providing civil penalties.), **As Introduced**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would require kratom processors and retailers to follow certain requirements related to labelling and selling kratom and would impose a civil penalty if the provisions are violated. It is assumed the provisions of the bill could be implemented within existing resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
