IN RE: HB1635 by Patterson (relating to a study on first responders' workers' compensation claims by the workers' compensation research and evaluation group.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.

The bill would amend the Labor Code relating to a study on first responders' workers' compensation claims by the workers' compensation research and evaluation group. Based on information provided by the Texas Department of Insurance, this analysis assumes that the duties and responsibilities associated with implementing the provisions of the bill could be accomplished by utilizing existing resources.
