**IN RE: HB2214** by Hefner (Relating to the expiration of a school marshal license issued or renewed by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.), **As Introduced**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
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It is assumed that the costs associated with the bill's provisions relating to the expiration of a school marshal license issued or renewed by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) could be absorbed using existing resources.

According to TCOLE, there would be savings to agency staff time and to the grant currently funding the program resulting from the syncing of expiration dates and a more efficient schedule that could be built for renewal courses.

This analysis assumes the provisions of the bill would not result in a significant impact on state correctional populations or on the demand for state correctional resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
