**IN RE: HB2295** by Wu (Relating to allowing certain counties to cease operation of a juvenile justice alternative education program.), **As Introduced**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
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The bill would amend the Education and Family Codes to allow certain counties to cease operation of a juvenile justice alternative education program.

It is assumed that the costs associated with the bill's provisions could be absorbed using existing resources.

**Local Government Impact**

Taylor County anticipates annual cost savings of \$621,268 should the county opt out of the Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Program. The fiscal impact to other counties is dependent on whether the county opts out of the program.
