**IN RE: HB2629** by Thompson, Senfronia (relating to the establishment of a registry for and requiring the registration of certain unmanned teller machines; imposing a fee; providing a civil penalty.),  
**Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

<p><b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b></p>
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It is assumed that the costs associated with the bill's provisions relating to the establishment of a registry for and requiring the registration of certain unmanned teller machines would have no fiscal impact on the state because the Department of Banking is a self-directed, semi-independent state entity and does not receive appropriated funds.

The bill would give the Office of the Attorney General the authority to seek injunctive relief and/or civil penalties against a person who violates this chapter, but the OAG anticipates that any additional work as a result of the passage and enforcement of this bill could be absorbed with current resources.

**Local Government Impact**

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
