IN RE: HB3111 by Meyer (Relating to the criminal offense of online solicitation relating to a minor; creating a criminal offense; changing eligibility for community supervision.), **Committee Report 1st House, Substituted**

The bill would amend the Penal Code to revise the definition of the criminal offense of online solicitation of a minor. Under the provisions of this bill, the definition of the criminal offense of online solicitation of a minor would be modified.

The Office of Court Administration and the Department of Criminal Justice indicate the modifications outlined in the bill's provisions would not result in a significant fiscal impact. This analysis assumes implementing the provisions of the bill addressing felony sanctions would not result in a significant impact on the demand for state correctional resources.

Local Government Impact

No significant fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
