**IN RE: SB355** by Miles (Relating to the civil penalty for certain signs placed on the right-of-way of a public road.), **As Engrossed**

<b>No significant fiscal implication to the State is anticipated.</b>
---

The bill would amend Transportation Code §393.007 to increase the civil penalty that may be imposed for placement of an unauthorized sign on the right-of-way of a public road from an amount not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 for each violation; to not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 for a first violation, \$5,000 for a second violation, and \$10,000 for a third or subsequent violation.

Based on the information provided by the Texas Department of Transportation, the Office of Court Administration, and the Comptroller's office, it is assumed implementation of the bill would not result in a significant operational or fiscal impact to the State.

**Local Government Impact**

The Texas Association of Counties anticipates a fiscal impact on counties, but in an amount that cannot be determined without data on illegal signage in unincorporated areas.
