IN RE: SB2154 by Schwertner (Relating to the membership of the Public Utility Commission of Texas.), **As Engrossed**

Estimated Two-year Net Impact to General Revenue Related Funds for SB2154, As Engrossed : a negative impact of (\$2,212,072) through the biennium ending August 31, 2023.

The bill would make no appropriation but could provide the legal basis for an appropriation of funds to implement the provisions of the bill.

Fiscal Analysis

The bill would increase the number of commissioners at the Public Utility Commission from three to five, as well as amend the rules for commissioner eligibility.

Methodology

The PUC anticipates that the cost associated with the bill is the cost of two commissioners, two commissioner advisors, and two support staff, plus the cost to construct two new commissioner office suites. Each commissioner salary is \$201,000; each advisor salary is \$135,000; and each support staff salary is \$55,000.

The PUC estimates a total of \$8,000 in other operating expense for these six new employees. The cost to construct two new commissioner office suites, which include multiple offices and a reception area, is estimated by facilities staff to be \$50,000 each, or \$100,000 total in the first year.

Technology

It is anticipated that there is no technological impact from this bill.

Local Government Impact

No fiscal implication to units of local government is anticipated.
