

The City of Fort Worth Neighborhood Services Department is inviting nonprofit social service agencies to respond to a Request for Proposals (RFP) for public service and architectural barrier removal programs that will provide benefits to eligible households. Funding awards made based on proposals submitted under this RFP will result in an annual contract dated from October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022.

This RFP is to award Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds, Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds, and Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA) funds for 2021-2022.

CDBG proposals must be for programs that provide services to low- and moderate-income City of Fort Worth persons and households. ESG proposals must address the needs of homeless individuals and families in the City of Fort Worth. HOPWA proposals must address the needs of persons with HIV/AIDS living in Tarrant, Johnson, Parker, Wise, Hood, or Somervell counties. The estimated funding amounts to be available for the 2021-22 Program Year are:

- CDBG: \$1,111,814
- ESG: \$390,944
- HOPWA: \$1,645,048

This is to give notice of intent to introduce in the 87th Legislature of the State of Texas, a bill to be entitled an Act relating to the creation, administration powers, duties, operation, and financing of the Hillcrest North Municipal Utility District of Wise County. The Act proposes to create a special district to be known as Hillcrest North Municipal Utility District of Wise County, being approximately 301.89 acres of land in Wise County, Texas, more particularly described as follows:

Tract one. Approximately 172.359 acres north of the intersection of CR 4213 and CR 4010 and immediately north of the Hillcrest North phase one addition in Wise County.

Tract two. Approximately 129.531 acres on the south side of CR 4010 approximately 2.700 feet east of CR 4213 in Wise County.

UPPER TRINITY GROUNDWATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT PUBLIC HEARING ON AMENDMENTS TO DISTRICT RULES EXTENDING THE DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR A HISTORIC USE PERMIT

January 22, 2021 at 5:00 PM
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all interested persons in Hood, Montague, Parker, and Wise counties, Texas, that the Board of Directors of the Upper Trinity Groundwater Conservation District ("District") will hold a public hearing, accept public comment, and may act to adopt amendments to the District Rules regu-

lating water wells within the boundaries of the District, including Hood, Montague, Parker, and Wise counties, Texas. The proposed amendments 1) extend the deadline to apply for a Historic Use Permit to on or before June 30, 2021; 2) exempt a well used solely for emergency purposes as described by the District Rules from the requirement to obtain a permit; 3) extend the deadline for the owners of certain existing non-exempt wells to register such wells with the District and install meters on such wells on or before October 31, 2020; 4) extend the deadline for the owners of such existing non-exempt wells to comply with the meter reading operating under a Historic Use permit will be issued a single permit for the entire well system rather than a permit for each individual well, and the aggregate annual groundwater production limit amount shall be assigned to the well system rather than allocated on a pro rata basis to each well, and other conforming changes to the District Rules.

The public meeting will be held on Monday, February 22, 2021, at 5:00 p.m. and will be conducted by online videoconference. A teleconference. Comments on the proposed adoption of amendments to the District Rules may be presented in writing or verbal form at the meeting.
