I encourage you to vote YES on this bill. A YES vote will have a positive impact financially and spiritually on the lives of seniors, disabled persons, veterans, and families of deployed personnel...those of us at the very core of our communities.

I live and have lived in two of the above categories: first, as part of a family of deployed personnel; now as a senior citizen. As a young mother of three small children my husband was called to duty in Vietnam twice. This meant moving to and from the protection of military housing. For military families like my own living in these conditions, any relief such as not having to pay a drainage bill is crucial. For many of us, it means grocery money.

Now, as a senior citizen I live in a condo in an area annexed by the City of Austin. Almost immediately the city flew a drone over our property and determined we have 622,076 sq. ft. of impervious cover. This comes out a monthly drainage fee of \$2,186.57. The city refused to bill each homeowner and is instead billing our property management, who we are required to reimburse. As a result of this assessment, myself and the other members of the community had to raise association dues to cover our new drainage fees. Our condo property is 60% senior citizens, most of whom moved here to downsize. For us this monthly drainage fee is a massive burden.

Even as a senior citizen of 81 years of age, I continue to work a part-time job to keep up with the cost of living. So, not having to pay this drainage fee would be a welcome relief to me and to many citizens in similar financial situations.

I once again urge you to vote YES on HB 824.

He has voted absentee in every election, taking his duty to vote very seriously. The first 4 years he received his ballots with no problem while a student in Virginia. As a law student at the University of Texas the first year he voted with ease until the presidential election. The Comal County elections office first gave him the wrong information (volunteers often get it wrong according to Cynthia Jaqua CCEO head) and told him his ballot had been mailed. It had not. Then some days I checked with the office on his behalf since I was doing my duty serving on the ballot board, the Elections Office head checked and it in fact had NEVER BEEN MAILED and claimed they never received his ballot request despite the fact that he had voted absentee for 5 1/2 years with ease. They ultimately mailed a new ballot though it was just at the deadline for absentee ballot requests and that ballot finally did come but two weeks AFTER the election due to POSTAL DELAYS. It's common sense to have electronic tracking. Why do we want to rely on volunteers in busy elections offices to provide such important information when this can be done with ease? Let's join modern times and make it EASIER for Texans to vote not more difficult!

I have worked as a member of the EVBB and as a precinct judge for elections. My concern about the proposed system is the potential for abuse to "harvest" or coerce votes by making the details public information of who has outstanding ballots. We know of cases in Texas where political operatives illegally intercept and collect mailed ballots. We also have documented cases of coercion and illegal assistance. In person voting provides a high degree of safeguards against coerced voting, but mail ballots are completed and returned in private so those safeguards to the VOTER are not provided. Name, address, and voter ID are publicly available information. I suggest that the mailed ballot include a unique, secure "pin" number for the voter to use to lookup their returned ballot status via a proposed public portal. If the "pin" is lost, the voter can call the Early Voting Clerk as is normally done. Tracking mailed ballot status should not be provided in mass format such as computer readable files or printed reports since the purpose should be to inform an individual voter of their personal ballot status, not to be used for public, political targeting. To address whether a ballot is mailed, the law should provide deadlines for the clerk to mail the ballots so voters know if the required deadline has passed and therefore such voter should follow up with the clerk directly as is currently the case.
