H.B. No. 315

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT
2 relating to the purchasing of a uniform by certain honorably
3 retired peace officers.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 614,
6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 SUBCHAPTER D. PURCHASE OF FIREARM OR UNIFORM OF HONORABLY
8 RETIRED OR DECEASED PEACE OFFICER

9 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 614, Government Code, is
10 amended by adding Section 614.055 to read as follows:

11 Sec. 614.055. PURCHASE OF UNIFORM BY HONORABLY RETIRED
12 STATE PEACE OFFICERS. (a) An individual may purchase a uniform
13 from a state agency if:

14 (1) the individual was a peace officer commissioned by
15 the agency;

16 (2) the individual was honorably retired from the
17 individual's commission by the agency; and

18 (3) the uniform had been previously issued to the
19 individual by the agency.

20 (b) A state agency shall establish the amount, which may not
21 exceed fair market value, for which a uniform may be purchased under
22 this section.

23 (c) An individual who purchases a uniform under this section
24 may be buried in the uniform.

1 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter D, Chapter 614,
6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

7 SUBCHAPTER D. PURCHASE OF FIREARM OR UNIFORM OF HONORABLY RETIRED,
8 MEDICALLY DISCHARGED, OR DECEASED PEACE OFFICER

9 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 614, Government Code, is
10 amended by adding Section 614.055 to read as follows:

11 Sec. 614.055. PURCHASE OF UNIFORM ISSUED TO HONORABLY
12 RETIRED AND CERTAIN MEDICALLY DISCHARGED STATE PEACE OFFICERS. (a)
13 An individual may purchase a uniform from a state agency if:

14 (1) the individual was a peace officer commissioned by
15 the agency;

16 (2) the individual was honorably retired or medically
17 discharged under conditions other than dishonorable from the
18 individual's commission by the agency; and

19 (3) the uniform had been previously issued to the
20 individual by the agency.

21 (b) The nearest surviving relative of an individual
22 described by Subsection (a) may purchase the individual's uniform
23 from the state agency.

24 (c) A state agency shall establish the amount, which may not

1 exceed fair market value, for which a uniform may be purchased under
2 this section.

3 (d) An individual who purchases a uniform or on whose behalf
4 a uniform is purchased under this section may be buried in the
5 uniform.

6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
