8	[and] 105.08, and 105.091, no person may sell, offer for sale, or	
9	deliver any liquor:	
10	(1) on New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day, or Christmas	
11	Day;	
12	(2) on Sunday; or	
13	(3) before 10 a.m. or after 9 p.m. on any other day.	
14	SECTION 2. Section 105.06, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is	
15	amended by amending Subsections (b) and (c) and adding Subsection	
16	5 (f) to read as follows:	
17	(b) Except as provided by Subsection (f), in $[In]$ a standard	
18	hours area, a person commits an offense if <u>the person</u> $[he]$ consumes	
19	or possesses with intent to consume an alcoholic beverage in a	
20	public place at any time on Sunday between 1:15 a.m. and 12 noon or	
21	on any other day between 12:15 a.m. and 7 a.m.	
22	(c) <u>Except as provided by Subsection (f), in</u> [In] an	
23	extended hours area, a person commits an offense if <u>the person</u> [he]	
24	consumes or possesses with intent to consume an alcoholic beverage	

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1 in a public place at any time on Sunday between 2:15 a.m. and 12 noon 2 and on any other day between 2:15 a.m. and 7 a.m. 3 (f) A person who is a registered guest of a hotel may consume 4 or possess alcoholic beverages in the hotel bar, as defined by Section 105.091, at any time. 5 6 SECTION 3. Chapter 105, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended 7 by adding Section 105.091 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 105.091. HOURS OF SALE; HOTEL BAR. (a) In this 9 section, "hotel bar" means an establishment that is located in a hotel and holds a permit or license providing for the on-premises 10 consumption of alcoholic beverages. 11 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, a hotel bar may sell or 12 offer for sale alcoholic beverages at any time to a registered guest 13 14 of the hotel. 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.

Amend <u>H</u>.B. No.<u><u>15</u>/<u>8</u> by adding the following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:</u>

4 SECTION _____. Section 24.07, Alcoholic Beverage Code, as 5 effective September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 24.07. HOURS OF SALE. A holder of a wine only package 6 store permit may remain open and sell malt beverages, wine, and 7 8 vinous liquors, for off-premises consumption only, on any day and during the same hours as those prescribed for the sale of malt 9 beverages under Section 105.05 [that the holder of a wine and malt 10 beverage retailer's permit may sell malt beverages and wine], 11 except that the permittee may not sell wine or vinous liquor 12 13 containing more than 17 percent alcohol by volume on a Sunday or after 10 p.m. on any day. 14

15 SECTION _____. Section 105.04, Alcoholic Beverage Code, as 16 effective September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 105.04. HOURS OF SALE: WINE MALT 17 AND BEVERAGE 18 RETAILER. The hours of sale and delivery for alcoholic beverages sold under a wine and malt beverage retailer's permit or a wine and 19 malt beverage retailer's off-premise permit are the same as those 20 prescribed for the sale of malt beverages under Section $105.05[_{ au}]$ 21 except that no sale shall be allowed between 2 a.m. and noon on 22 23 Sunday].

24 SECTION ____. Section 105.05(b), Alcoholic Beverage Code, 25 as effective September 1, 2021, is amended to read as follows:

(b) A person may sell, offer for sale, or deliver malt
beverages between 7 a.m. and midnight on any day except Sunday. On
Sunday a person may sell malt beverages between midnight and 1:00
a.m. and between noon and midnight, except that:

1 (1) permittees or licensees authorized to sell for 2 on-premise consumption may sell malt beverages between 10:00 a.m. 3 and noon if the malt beverages are served to a customer during the 4 service of food to the customer; and 5 (2) holders of a retail dealer's on-premise license or

6 a retail dealer's off-premise license may also sell malt beverages
7 for off-premise consumption between 10:00 a.m. and noon.
