4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 341.0645, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c), (d), 7 (e), (f), and (g) to read as follows:

8 (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt by rule pool 9 safety standards necessary to prevent drowning. The standards must: 10 <u>(1)</u> be at least as stringent as those imposed under the 11 federal Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 12 Section 8001 et seq.); and

13 (2) comply with and adopt by reference a version of the 14 International Swimming Pool and Spa Code, as defined by Section 15 214.103, Local Government Code, that is not older than the version 16 in effect on May 1, 2019, regarding all construction, alteration, 17 renovation, enlargement, and repair of commercial swimming pools 18 and spas.

19 (c) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), the department is not 20 required to adopt Chapter 1 of the International Swimming Pool and 21 Spa Code.

22 (d) Subsection (b) does not affect requirements for pool
23 yard enclosure imposed under Chapter 757.

24 (e) The executive commissioner by rule shall authorize a

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1 minor addition, alteration, renovation, or repair to an existing 2 pool or spa and related mechanical, electrical, and plumbing 3 systems in the same manner and arrangement as the executive 4 commissioner authorized the construction of the pool or spa and 5 related mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems.

6 (f) A person may use, maintain, and repair a pool or spa that 7 was in compliance with the laws of this state on August 31, 2021, 8 and related mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems in 9 accordance with the laws applicable to the pool or system on that 10 date.

11 (g) Notwithstanding Subsection (b)(2), this section does 12 not affect the authority of the executive commissioner to adopt 13 rules regarding pool operation and management, water quality, 14 safety standards unrelated to design and construction, signage, and 15 enclosures.

16 SECTION 2. Section 214.103, Local Government Code, is 17 amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (b-1) to 18 read as follows:

(b) To protect the public health, safety, and welfare, the International Swimming Pool and Spa Code, as it existed on May 1, 2019, is adopted as the municipal swimming pool and spa code in this state. <u>A municipality may adopt a more recent version of the</u> <u>International Swimming Pool and Spa Code to apply in the</u> <u>municipality.</u>
