11	the same lot or tract, and managed by the same owner, agent, or

13	(2) "Commercial motor vehicle" has the meaning
14	assigned by Section 545.307.
15	(b) This section applies only to a county or municipality
16	with a population of more than 220,000.
17	(c) The owner or manager of an apartment complex may make a
18	request to a county or municipality in which the apartment complex
19	is located for the posting of official signs prohibiting the
20	parking of a commercial motor vehicle in a public right-of-way
21	adjacent to the complex after 10 p.m. and before 6 a.m. A request
22	under this subsection must be signed and in writing.
23	(d) A county or municipality receiving a request under
24	Subsection (c) may post one or more signs as requested or as the

1	county or municipality determines to be necessary.
2	(e) A sign posted under Subsection (d) must:
3	(1) be posted in the public right-of-way:
4	(A) not more than 10 feet from the property line
5	of the apartment complex; and
6	(B) facing the roadway; and
7	(2) include:
8	(A) a statement, in letters at least two inches
9	in height, that parking of a commercial motor vehicle is prohibited
10	from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. in the public right-of-way or portion of the
11	<pre>public right-of-way; and</pre>
12	(B) arrows clearly indicating the area of the
13	public right-of-way subject to the parking restriction.
14	(f) This section does not apply to a vehicle owned by a
15	commercial establishment that is parked in the public right-of-way
16	adjacent to the property where the establishment is located.
17	(g) This section does not apply to public rights-of-way that
18	are part of the state highway system.
