4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 162.001, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
7	(3) "State Advisory Council" means the State Advisory
8	Council on Educational Opportunity for Military Children
9	established under Section 162.006.
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 162, Education Code, is amended by
11	adding Section 162.006 to read as follows:
12	Sec. 162.006. STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL AND COORDINATION. (a)
13	The compact commissioner, in coordination with the Texas Education
14	Agency, shall establish the State Advisory Council on Educational
15	Opportunity for Military Children to provide for coordination among
16	state agencies, school districts, and military installations
17	concerning the state's participation in and compliance with the
18	compact and compact activities, as required by Article VIII of the
19	compact.
20	(b) The State Advisory Council consists of:
21	(1) the commissioner of education or the
22	commissioner's designee;
23	(2) a superintendent of a school district with a high
24	concentration of military children designated by the agency;

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1	(3) the governor or the governor's designee;
2	(4) the chair of the senate committee on education or a
3	member of the senate committee on education designated by the
4	agency;
5	(5) the chair of the house of representatives
6	committee on public education or a member of the house of
7	representatives committee on public education designated by the
8	agency;
9	(6) a representative from each branch of the armed
10	services of the United States that maintains an installation in the
11	state, designated by the agency; and
12	(7) representatives of other offices and stakeholder
13	groups the agency deems appropriate.
14	(c) Members of the State Advisory Council may delegate
15	voting authority to another person for a specified meeting or
16	meetings.
17	(d) Meetings of the State Advisory Council may be conducted
18	face-to-face or by telephone or other means of telecommunication or
19	electronic communication.
20	(e) The State Advisory Council shall:
21	(1) meet at least quarterly; and
22	(2) provide State Advisory Council meeting dates,
23	agendas, minutes, end-of-year reports, and other documentation as
24	required to the Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission.
25	(f) The State Advisory Council shall perform each function
26	or duty required or authorized under Article VIII of the compact.
27	(g) The State Advisory Council shall establish policies and

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1	procedures governing the State Advisory Council's operations.
2	(h) The State Advisory Council is a governmental body for
3	purposes of Chapter 551, Government Code.
4	SECTION 3. Section 162.005, Education Code, is repealed.
5	SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
