A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment excepting certain
- 2 appropriations to pay for school district ad valorem tax relief
- 3 from the constitutional limitation on the rate of growth of
- 4 appropriations.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 22, Article VIII, Texas Constitution, is
- 7 amended by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 8 <u>(a-1)</u> Appropriations from state tax revenues not dedicated
- 9 by this constitution that are made for the purpose of paying for
- 10 school district ad valorem tax relief as identified by the
- 11 legislature by general law are not included as appropriations for
- 12 purposes of determining whether the rate of growth of
- 13 appropriations exceeds the limitation prescribed by Subsection (a)
- 14 of this section.
- 15 SECTION 2. The following temporary provision is added to
- 16 the Texas Constitution:
- 17 TEMPORARY PROVISION. (a) This temporary provision applies
- 18 to the amendment to Section 22, Article VIII, of this constitution
- 19 as proposed by the 88th Legislature, 1st Called Session, 2023,
- 20 excepting certain appropriations to pay for school district ad
- 21 valorem tax relief from the constitutional limitation on the rate
- 22 of growth of appropriations.
- 23 (b) The change made to Section 22, Article VIII, of this
- 24 constitution by the amendment applies to appropriations made for

- 1 the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, and
- 2 <u>subsequent state fiscal bienniums</u>.
- 3 (c) This temporary provision expires September 1, 2025.
- 4 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 5 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 7, 2023.
- 6 The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the
- 7 proposition: "The constitutional amendment excepting certain
- 8 appropriations to pay for school district property tax relief from
- 9 the constitutional limitation on the rate of growth of
- 10 appropriations."
