| 5 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: |
| 6 | SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding |
| 7 | Subchapter R to read as follows: |
| 8 | SUBCHAPTER R. PARENT-DIRECTED SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES PROGRAM |
| 9 | Sec. 29.751. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: |
| 10 | (1) "Parent" has the meaning assigned by Section |
| 11 | 29.041. |
| 12 | (2) "Supplemental instructional materials" includes |
| 13 | textbooks, computer hardware or software, other technological |
| 14 | devices, and other materials suitable for addressing an educational |
| 15 | need of a public school student. |
| 16 | (3) "Supplemental services" means an additive service |
| 17 | that provides an educational benefit to a public school student |
| 18 | including: |
| 19 | (A) virtual, advanced, and trade-related |
| 20 | programs; |
| 21 | (B) extracurricular activities; |
| 22 | (C) private tutoring and other supplemental |
| 23 | private instruction or programs; and |
| 24 | (D) college credit. |

- 1 Sec. 29.752. ESTABLISHMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM.
- 2 (a) The agency by rule shall establish and administer a
- 3 parent-directed program for public school students through which a
- 4 parent of a student who meets the eligibility requirements for
- 5 participation in the program may select supplemental services and
- 6 supplemental instructional materials for use by the parent's
- 7 student. From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency shall
- 8 provide each student approved for participation in the program
- 9 under this subchapter a grant as provided by Section 48.305 to
- 10 purchase supplemental services and supplemental instructional
- 11 materials.
- 12 (b) In administering the program, the agency shall maintain
- 13 a system of online accounts to provide to an eligible student's
- 14 parent access to the grant described by Subsection (a).
- 15 <u>(c)</u> The agency shall designate one or more regional
- 16 education service centers to administer the program under this
- 17 section.
- 18 <u>(d) The agency shall establish a procedure</u> by which a
- 19 student may initiate a transfer of control of the account, from the
- 20 parent to the student, for the use of unexpended money in the
- 21 account at the time of the student's graduation in accordance with
- 22 Section 29.756(d).
- 23 Sec. 29.753. APPLICATION FOR GRANT ON BEHALF OF STUDENT.
- 24 The agency shall establish an application process for an eligible
- 25 student's parent to apply for a grant held in an online account
- 26 maintained under Section 29.752(b) and assigned to the student
- 27 under <u>Section 29.755.</u>

- 1 Sec. 29.754. PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA. (a) The agency
- 2 shall establish eligibility criteria for the approval of an
- 3 application submitted under Section 29.753. The criteria must
- 4 require that the student be enrolled in the current school year at a
- 5 school district or open-enrollment charter school.
- 6 (b) The eligibility criteria established under this section
- 7 <u>must also prioritize students for whom a school district or</u>
- 8 open-enrollment charter school is entitled to the compensatory
- 9 education allotment under Section 48.104.
- 10 <u>(c) A student may receive a grant once under this subchapter</u>
- 11 while enrolled in kindergarten through grade 12. A student may
- 12 receive an additional grant under this subchapter if the
- 13 legislature appropriates money for that purpose.
- 14 Sec. 29.755. APPROVAL OF APPLICATION; ASSIGNMENT OF
- 15 ACCOUNT. The agency shall approve each student who meets the
- 16 program eligibility criteria established under Section 29.754 and
- 17 assign to the student an account maintained under Section
- 18 29.752(b). The account may only be used by the student's parent or
- 19 the student as provided by Section 29.752(d) to purchase
- 20 supplemental services or supplemental instructional materials for
- 21 the student, subject to Sections 29.756 and 29.757.
- Sec. 29.756. ACCOUNT USE RESTRICTION. (a) Money in an
- 23 account assigned to a student under Section 29.755 may be used only
- 24 for supplemental services, supplemental instructional materials,
- 25 and expenditures for tuition and fees as authorized under
- 26 Subsection (d).
- (b) Any supplemental services purchased under the program

- 1 under this subchapter must be provided by an agency-approved
- 2 provider.
- 3 (c) If the agency has approved vendors for a category of
- 4 supplemental instructional materials under Section 29.757,
- 5 supplemental instructional materials must be purchased from an
- 6 agency-approved vendor for that category of supplemental
- 7 instructional materials. If the agency does not establish criteria
- 8 for agency approval for a category of supplemental instructional
- 9 materials, money in the student's account may be used to purchase
- 10 the supplemental instructional materials from any vendor.
- 11 (d) The commissioner by rule shall authorize the use of
- 12 money in an account assigned to a student under Section 29.755 to be
- 13 spent on tuition and fees at an institution of higher education or
- 14 private or independent institution of higher education, including
- 15 any unexpended money in a student's account at the time of the
- 16 student's graduation. Any remaining unexpended money in a
- 17 student's account on the sixth anniversary of the student's
- 18 graduation shall be returned to the agency for purposes of the
- 19 program.
- Sec. 29.757. AGENCY-APPROVED PROVIDERS AND VENDORS:
- 21 CRITERIA AND APPLICATION. (a) The agency shall establish criteria
- 22 necessary for agency approval for each category of provider of a
- 23 professional service that is a supplemental service, as identified
- 24 by the agency.
- 25 (b) The criteria established under this section must
- 26 require a provider of a category of professional service to be
- 27 appropriately licensed or accredited in this state to provide that

- 1 <u>service.</u>
- 2 (c) The agency shall provide a procedure for providers of
- 3 supplemental services to apply to the agency to become an
- 4 agency-approved provider.
- 5 (d) The agency may establish criteria for agency approval of
- 6 vendors for each category of supplemental instructional materials
- 7 <u>identified by the agency.</u>
- 8 (e) If the agency establishes criteria for agency approval
- 9 for a vendor of a category of supplemental instructional materials,
- 10 the agency shall provide a procedure for vendors of that category to
- 11 apply to the agency to become an agency-approved vendor.
- 12 Sec. 29.758. PUBLIC SCHOOL PROVIDERS. A school district or
- 13 open-enrollment charter school provider approved under Section
- 14 29.757 may charge a fee for supplemental instructional materials or
- 15 supplemental services provided to a student under this subchapter
- 16 that otherwise would not have been provided to the student by the
- 17 <u>district or school.</u>
- 18 Sec. 29.759. ADMISSION, REVIEW, AND DISMISSAL COMMITTEE
- 19 <u>DUTIES</u>. (a) A student's admission, review, and dismissal
- 20 committee shall develop a student's individualized education
- 21 program under Section 29.005, in compliance with the Individuals
- 22 with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.),
- 23 without consideration of any supplemental services or supplemental
- 24 instructional materials that may be provided under the program
- 25 under this subchapter.
- 26 (b) Unless the district determines that an account has been
- 27 assigned to the student under Section 29.045, the admission,

- 1 review, and dismissal committee of a student approved for
- 2 participation in the program shall provide to the student's parent
- 3 at an admission, review, and dismissal committee meeting for the
- 4 student:
- 5 (1) information regarding the types of supplemental
- 6 services or supplemental instructional materials available under
- 7 the program and provided by agency-approved providers for which an
- 8 account maintained under Section 29.752(b) for the student may be
- 9 used; and
- 10 (2) instructions regarding accessing an account
- 11 described by Subdivision (1).
- 12 Sec. 29.760. DETERMINATION OF COMMISSIONER FINAL.
- 13 Notwithstanding Section 7.057, a determination of the commissioner
- 14 under this subchapter is final and may not be appealed.
- Sec. 29.761. RULES. The commissioner shall adopt rules as
- 16 necessary to administer the supplemental services and
- 17 instructional materials program under this subchapter.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 48.305 to read as follows:
- Sec. 48.305. PARENT-DIRECTED SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES PROGRAM
- 21 GRANT. (a) A student to whom the agency awards a grant under
- 22 Subchapter R, Chapter 29, is entitled to receive a grant equal to
- 23 \$1,000 or a greater amount provided by appropriation.
- 24 (b) The agency shall use money appropriated to the agency
- 25 for purposes of this section to award grants under Subchapter R,
- 26 Chapter 29.
- SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2023, the

- 1 commissioner of education shall adopt all rules necessary for the
- 2 establishment and administration of the parent-directed
- 3 supplemental services program required under Subchapter R, Chapter
- 4 29, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of the
- 10 legislative session.
