	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a grant program to provide
3	financial assistance to qualified sheriff's departments in certain
4	rural counties; making an appropriation.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	ARTICLE 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS
7	SECTION 1.01. The legislature finds that:
8	(1) the legislature acting with the governor has the
9	solemn duty to protect the citizens of this state;
10	(2) many rural counties of this state are experiencing
11	rapid population growth due to the influx of individuals from
12	metropolitan areas and from outside the state;
13	(3) many of these individuals settle in developments

- like Colony Ridge in Liberty County, leading to population growth 14
- and population density previously unseen in these rural counties; 15
- 16 and
- 17 (4) the increases in population and density strain the
- resources of these rural counties to provide adequate public 18
- services to their citizens, particularly when it comes to providing 19
- 20 law enforcement in unincorporated areas of the county.
- 21 ARTICLE 2. RURAL SHERIFF'S DEPUTY SHORTAGE RELIEF
- 22 SECTION 2.01. Subchapter Z, Chapter 130, Local Government
- Code, is amended by adding Section 130.914 to read as follows: 23
- Sec. 130.914. RURAL SHERIFF'S DEPUTY SHORTAGE RELIEF GRANT 24

1 PROGRAM. (a) In this section: 2 (1) "Grant" means a grant authorized to be awarded by 3 the comptroller under the rural sheriff's deputy shortage relief grant program established by this section. 4 5 (2) "Qualified county" means a county: 6 (A) with a population of 300,000 or less; and 7 (B) for which on January 1, 2024, the ratio of the 8 number of deputy sheriffs who make motor vehicle stops in the routine performance of the deputies' duties to the number of 9 10 residents of the unincorporated areas of the county on that date, as determined by population estimates provided by the state 11 12 demographer under Section 468.004, Government Code, is less than 15 13 deputies to each 10,000 residents. (3) "Qualified deputy position" means a deputy sheriff 14 15 position in a qualified county that: 16 (A) is held or will be held by a deputy sheriff 17 who makes motor vehicle stops in the routine performance of the 18 deputy's duties; 19 (B) is in addition to a deputy sheriff position held in the county on January 1, 2024; and 20 21 (C) when aggregated with each other qualified deputy position would result in a number of deputy sheriffs who 22 perform the duty described by Paragraph (A) equal to the number of 23 24 deputies needed to meet the ratio of 15 deputies to each 10,000 residents, calculated as described by Subdivision (2)(B) as of 25 26 January 1, 2024.

(b) The comptroller shall establish and administer the

- 2 the state purpose of ensuring professional law enforcement
- 3 throughout the state by providing financial assistance to
- 4 sheriff's departments in qualified counties.
- 5 (c) Not later than the 30th day after the first day of a
- 6 qualified county's fiscal year, the county may submit an
- 7 application for a grant to the comptroller. The county must
- 8 indicate in the application the number of qualified deputy
- 9 positions the county is requesting for inclusion in the
- 10 determination of the amount of the grant for that fiscal year and
- 11 the number for which the county is requesting additional funds
- 12 described by <u>Subsection</u> (d)(2). A county may submit only one
- 13 application each fiscal year.
- 14 (d) The comptroller shall award a grant to a qualified
- 15 county that applies for the grant using money appropriated to the
- 16 comptroller for that purpose. The grant must be in the following
- 17 amount:
- 18 (1) \$50,000 for each qualified deputy position
- 19 indicated by the county in the application for that fiscal year; and
- 20 (2) an additional \$50,000 for each qualified deputy
- 21 position indicated in the application for that fiscal year, unless
- 22 the county has received a grant under this subdivision for that
- 23 position in a preceding fiscal year.
- 24 (e) A county that is awarded a grant shall use or authorize
- 25 the use of the grant money only:
- 26 (1) to provide to each deputy sheriff who fills a
- 27 qualified deputy position a minimum annual salary of at least

- 1 \$45,000; and
- 2 (2) subject to Subsection (f), to purchase vehicles,
- 3 firearms, and safety equipment for the use of a deputy sheriff who
- 4 fills a qualified deputy position.
- 5 (f) A county that is awarded a grant may not use or authorize
- 6 the use of the grant money for a purpose other than prescribed by
- 7 <u>Subsection (e)(1) until that requirement is satisfied.</u>
- 8 (g) A county that is awarded a grant may not reduce the
- 9 sheriff's department budget for the county's fiscal year following
- 10 the fiscal year in which the comptroller awards the grant.
- 11 (h) Subject to Subsections (h-1) and (i), a county that
- 12 received a grant under this subdivision in a preceding fiscal year
- 13 is eligible for an award if it maintains the ratio of the number of
- 14 deputy sheriffs who make motor vehicle stops in the routine
- 15 performance of the deputies' duties to the number of residents of
- 16 the unincorporated areas of the county for the calendar year the
- 17 application is made, as determined by population estimates provided
- 18 by the state demographer under Section 468.004, Government Code,
- 19 equal to or above 15 deputies to each 10,000 residents.
- 20 (h-1) Subsection (h) only applies to a county that received
- 21 <u>a grant under this subdivision in a preceding fiscal year and its</u>
- 22 ratio of the number of deputy sheriffs who make motor vehicle stops
- 23 in the routine performance of the deputies' duties to the number of
- 24 residents of the unincorporated areas of the county for that
- 25 preceding fiscal year was, as determined by population estimates
- 26 provided by the state demographer under Section 468.004, Government
- 27 Code, equal to or above 15 deputies to each 10,000 residents.

1	(i) For a county that has received a grant under this
2	subdivision in a preceding fiscal year and applies for an award
3	under this subdivision, if the ratio of the number of deputy
4	sheriffs who make motor vehicle stops in the routine performance of
5	the deputies' duties to the number of residents of the
6	unincorporated areas of the county for the calendar year the
7	application is made, as determined by population estimates provided
8	by the state demographer under Section 468.004, Government Code, is
9	above 16 deputies to each 10,000 residents, any award shall be
10	reduced in \$50,000 increments for every deputy sheriff who makes
11	motor vehicle stops in the routine performance of the deputies'
12	duties above 16 deputies to each 10,000 residents.
13	(j) The comptroller shall adopt rules necessary to
14	implement this section, including rules that establish:
15	(1) a standardized application process, including the
16	form to be used to apply for a grant and the manner of submitting the
17	<pre>form;</pre>
18	(2) deadlines for:
19	(A) applying for the grant;
20	(B) disbursement of grant money; and
21	(C) spending grant money; and
22	(3) procedures for:
23	(A) monitoring the disbursement of grant money to
24	ensure compliance with this section; and
25	(B) the return of grant money that was not used by
26	a county for a purpose authorized by this section.
27	ARTICLE 3. APPROPRIATION

- 1 SECTION 3.01. APPROPRIATION TO THE COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC
- 2 ACCOUNTS. The amount of \$100,000,000 is appropriated from the
- 3 general revenue fund to the Fiscal Programs within the Comptroller
- 4 of Public Accounts for use during the two-year period beginning on
- 5 the effective date of this Act for the establishment of a grant
- 6 program to provide financial assistance to qualified sheriff's
- 7 departments in certain rural counties.
- 8 ARTICLE 4. TRANSITIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE
- 9 SECTION 4.01. A qualified county, as defined by Section
- 10 130.914, Local Government Code, as added by this Act, may not apply
- 11 for a grant under that section before March 1, 2024.
- 12 SECTION 4.02. Not later than March 1, 2024, the comptroller
- 13 of public accounts shall comply with the requirements of Section
- 14 130.914, Local Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4.03. This Act takes effect immediately if it
- 16 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each
- 17 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
- 18 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate
- 19 effect, this Act takes effect on the 91st day after the last day of
- 20 the legislative session.
