4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section $46.01(3)$, Penal Code, is amended to read
6	as follows:
7	(3) "Firearm" means any device designed, made, or
8	adapted to expel a projectile through a barrel by using the energy
9	generated by an explosion or burning substance or any device
10	readily convertible to that use. Firearm does not include $\underline{:}$
11	$\overline{(A)}$ a firearm that may have, as an integral part,
12	a folding knife blade or other characteristics of weapons made
13	illegal by this chapter and that is:
14	$\underline{\text{(i)}}$ [$\frac{\text{(A)}}{\text{(A)}}$] an antique or curio firearm
15	manufactured before 1899; or
16	<u>(ii)</u> [(B)] a replica of an antique or
17	curio firearm manufactured before 1899, but only if the replica
18	does not use rim fire or center fire ammunition; or

- 19 <u>(B) a less-lethal projectile device</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 46.01, Penal Code, is amended by adding
- 21 Subdivision (21) to read as follows:
- 22 (21) "Less-lethal projectile device" means any
- 23 weapon, device, or munition that is designed, made, or adapted to
- 24 expel a projectile or multiple projectiles against a target to

- 1 temporarily incapacitate the target while minimizing the risk of
- 2 serious bodily injury or death.
- 3 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 8 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 9 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 10 before that date.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 12 last day of the legislative session.
