1 WHEREAS, The City of Mont Belvieu is hosting the grand
2 opening of its new city hall and fire station on November 14, 2023;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, The new facilities will serve to anchor what the
5 city has envisioned as a livable, mixed-use downtown area and to
6 replace the old municipal complex, which was built in 1991; and

7 WHEREAS, Mont Belvieu broke ground on the city hall on
8 March 18, 2021; encompassing nearly 31,000 square feet, the
9 building will house a majority of the city's departments, allowing
10 for more efficient interdepartmental collaboration and improved
11 customer service for residents; the structure includes multiple
12 conference rooms and additional space for future growth; and

13 WHEREAS, Located across the street from the new city hall,
14 Mont Belvieu Fire Station 1 will enable the city's volunteer
15 firefighters and full-time paramedics to better serve the community
16 and achieve faster response times; the station has such amenities
17 as a public lobby with a treatment room for walk-in patients,
18 training and fitness rooms, dormitories, and decontamination
19 facilities; and

20 WHEREAS, Mont Belvieu's impressive new city hall and fire
21 station are sure to be a significant resource to the community for
22 years to come, and it is a pleasure to join in recognizing the
23 vision, leadership, and hard work of those who helped bring this
24 project to fruition; now, therefore, be it
