A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the small and mid-sized district allotment under the
- 3 public school finance system.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 48.101, Subchapter C, Chapter 48,
- 6 Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 48.101. SMALL AND MID-SIZED DISTRICT ALLOTMENT. (a)
- 8 Small and mid-sized districts are entitled to an annual allotment
- 9 in accordance with this section. In this section:
- 10 (1) "AA" is the district's annual allotment per
- 11 student in average daily attendance;
- 12 (2) "ADA" is the number of students in average daily
- 13 attendance for which the district is entitled to an allotment under
- 14 Section 48.051; and
- 15 (3) "BA" is the basic allotment determined under
- 16 Section 48.051.
- 17 (b) A school district that has fewer than 1,600 students in
- 18 average daily attendance is entitled to an annual allotment for
- 19 each student in average daily attendance based on the following
- 20 formula:
- 21 $AA = ((1,600 ADA) \times .0004 .0008) \times BA$
- (c) A school district that offers a kindergarten through
- 23 grade 12 program and has less than 5,000 students in average daily
- 24 attendance is entitled to an annual allotment for each student in

- 1 average daily attendance based on the formula, of the following
- 2 formulas, that results in the greatest annual allotment:
- 3 (1) the formula in Subsection (b), if the district is
- 4 eligible for that formula; or
- 5 (2) $AA = ((5,000 ADA) \times .000025 .00005) \times BA.$
- 6 (d) Instead of the allotment under Subsection (b) or (c)(1),
- 7 a school district that has fewer than 300 students in average daily
- 8 attendance and is the only school district located in and operating
- 9 in a county is entitled to an annual allotment for each student in
- 10 average daily attendance based on the following formula:
- 11 $AA = ((1,600 ADA) \times .00047 .00094) \times BA$
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 13 last day of the legislative session.
