4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.4023 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.4023. BONUS PAYMENT FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR. (a)
8	For the 2023-2024 school year, a school district shall provide to
9	each classroom teacher, full-time librarian, full-time school
10	counselor certified under Subchapter B, or full-time school nurse
11	employed by the district a one-time bonus payment of \$15,000 in
12	addition to the employee's compensation for the 2023-2024 school
13	year to be paid to the employee at the end of the 2023-2024 school
14	year.
15	(b) A bonus payment provided to a classroom teacher under
16	this section is not considered in determining whether a school
17	district is paying the teacher the minimum monthly salary under
18	<u>Section 21.402.</u>
19	(c) This section expires September 1, 2024.
20	SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 22, Education Code, is

- 12 each student in average daily attendance, not including the time

- 15 technology education programs, for which an additional allotment is
- 16 made under Subchapter C, a district is entitled to an allotment
- 17 equal to the lesser of \$8,947 [\$6,160] or the amount that results
- 18 from the following formula:
- 19 $A = \$8,947 \ [\$6,160] \ X \ TR/MCR$
- 20 where:
- 21 "A" is the allotment to which a district is entitled;
- "TR" is the district's tier one maintenance and operations
- 23 tax rate, as provided by Section 45.0032; and
- 24 "MCR" is the district's maximum compressed tax rate, as
- 25 determined under Section 48.2551.
- 26 (a-1) Beginning with the 2025-2026 school year, the basic
- 27 allotment provided to a district under Subsection (a) or (b) is

- adjusted annually to increase the allotment by the amount that 1
- results from applying the inflation rate, as determined by the 2
- 3 comptroller on the basis of changes in the Consumer Price Index for
- All Urban Consumers published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of 4
- 5 the United States Department of Labor, to the allotment for the
- 6 preceding school year.
- 7 (a-2) If the inflation rate for a school year is less than
- zero, the inflation rate to be used for purposes of Subsection (a-1) 8
- 9 is zero.
- 10 During any school year for which the maximum amount of
- the basic allotment provided under Subsection (a) or (b) is greater 11
- than the maximum amount provided for the preceding school year, a 12
- school district must use at least 40 [30] percent of the amount, if 13
- 14 the amount is greater than zero, that equals the product of the
- 15 average daily attendance of the district multiplied by the amount
- of the difference between the district's funding under this chapter 16
- 17 per student in average daily attendance for the current school year
- and the preceding school year to provide compensation increases to 18
- 19 full-time district employees other than administrators as follows:
- (1) 75 percent used to increase the 20 must bе

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- 26 (2) 25 percent may be used as determined by the
- 27 district to increase compensation paid to full-time district

- 2 SECTION 4. Section 48.102, Education Code, is amended by
- 3 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 4 (a-1) To address the extraordinary gap between the amount of
- 5 the allotment under this section and school district expenses for
- 6 special education, a school district that for the 2023-2024 school
- 7 year spent a greater amount for students in a special education
- 8 program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, than the amount the
- 9 district received from the allotment under this section is entitled
- 10 to additional funding for the 2024-2025 school year in an amount
- 11 equal to twice the amount of the difference between the total of
- 12 those amounts. This subsection expires September 1, 2025.
- SECTION 5. Section 48.115, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 adding Subsection (a-2) to read as follows:
- 15 <u>(a-2)</u> To address the extraordinary gap between the amount of
- 16 the allotment under this section and school district expenses for
- 17 school safety and security improvements, a school district that for
- 18 the 2023-2024 school year spent a greater amount for school safety
- 19 and security improvements than the amount the district received
- 20 from the allotment under this section is entitled to additional
- 21 <u>funding for the 2024-2025 school year in an amount equal to the</u>
- 22 difference between the total of those amounts. This subsection
- 23 expires September 1, 2025.
- SECTION 6. Subchapter D, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 25 amended by adding Section 48.157 to read as follows:
- Sec. 48.157. SUPPLEMENTAL GRANT TO ADDRESS EDUCATIONAL
- 27 NEEDS FOLLOWING COVID-19 PANDEMIC. (a) For the 2023-2024 school

- 1 year, a school district is entitled to a grant of \$800 for each
- 2 student enrolled in the district to ensure that the school district
- 3 has adequate funding to address the educational needs of the
- 4 district's students following the coronavirus disease (COVID-19)
- 5 pandemic.
- 6 (b) This section expires September 1, 2024.
- 7 SECTION 7. Effective September 1, 2024, Section
- 8 48.202(a-1), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 (a-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), the dollar amount
- 10 guaranteed level of state and local funds per weighted student per
- 11 cent of tax effort ("GL") for a school district is:
- 12 (1) the greater of the amount of district tax revenue
- 13 per weighted student per cent of tax effort available to a school
- 14 district at the 96th percentile of wealth per weighted student or
- 15 the amount that results from multiplying $\frac{\$8,947}{}$ [$\frac{\$8,947}{}$], or the
- 16 greater amount provided under Section 48.051(a-1) or (b)
- 17 $\left[\frac{48.051(b)}{c}\right]$, if applicable, by 0.016, for the first eight cents by
- 18 which the district's maintenance and operations tax rate exceeds
- 19 the district's tier one tax rate; and
- 20 (2) subject to Subsection (f), the amount that results
- 21 from multiplying \$8,947 [\$6,160], or the greater amount provided
- 22 under Section 48.051(a-1) or (b) [48.051(b)], if applicable, by
- 23 0.008, for the district's maintenance and operations tax effort
- 24 that exceeds the amount of tax effort described by Subdivision (1).
- 25 SECTION 8. Subchapter F, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 26 amended by adding Section 48.2521 to read as follows:
- Sec. 48.2521. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR ONE-TIME BONUSES FOR

- 1 CERTAIN PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES. (a) For the 2023-2024 school
- 2 year, a school district, including a school district that is
- 3 otherwise ineligible for state aid under this chapter, is entitled
- 4 to annual state aid in the sum of:
- 5 (1) the amount equal to the product of \$15,000
- 6 multiplied by the number of classroom teachers, full-time
- 7 <u>librarians, full-time school counselors certified under Subchapter</u>
- 8 B, Chapter 21, and full-time school nurses employed by the
- 9 district; and
- 10 (2) the amount equal to the product of \$5,500
- 11 multiplied by the number of employees, other than an administrator
- 12 or an employee subject to the minimum salary schedule under Section
- 13 21.402, employed by the district who are compensated less than
- 14 \$100,000 per year in salary or wages.
- 15 (b) A school district shall use the amount received under
- 16 this section for purposes of providing the one-time bonus payments
- 17 under Sections 21.4023 and 22.008.
- 18 (c) This section expires September 1, 2024.
- 19 SECTION 9. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this
- 20 Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of
- 21 all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39,
- 22 Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the
- 23 vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect on the
- 24 91st day after the last day of the legislative session.
