## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the minimum number of instructional days provided by
- 3 public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.081, Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.081. OPERATION OF SCHOOLS. (a) Except as
- 8 authorized under Subsection (a-1) or (b) of this section, Section
- 9 25.0815, Section 25.084, or Section 29.0821, for each school year
- 10 each school district must operate:
- 11 (1) for a minimum of 175 instructional days; and
- 12 <u>(2)</u> for at least 75,600 minutes of operation,
- 13 including time allocated for instruction, intermissions, and
- 14 recesses for students.
- 15 (a-1) Subsection (a)(1) does not apply to a school district
- 16 with a student enrollment of less than 8,000.
- 17 (b) The commissioner may approve the operation of schools
- 18 for fewer than the number of <u>instructional days or</u> minutes <u>of</u>
- 19 operation required under Subsection (a) if disaster, flood, extreme
- 20 weather conditions, fuel curtailment, or another calamity causes
- 21 the closing of schools.
- (c) If the commissioner does not approve reduced
- 23 instructional days or minutes of operation [time] under Subsection
- 24 (b), a school district may add additional instructional days to the

- 1 school year or minutes of operation to the end of the district's
- 2 normal school hours as necessary to compensate for instructional
- 3 days or minutes of operation lost due to school closures caused by
- 4 disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions, fuel curtailment, or
- 5 another calamity.
- 6 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules to implement this 7 section, including rules:
- 8 (1) [for the application, on the basis of the minimum
- 9 minutes of operation required by Subsection (a), of any provision
- 10 of this title that refers to a minimum number of days of instruction
- 11 under this section;
- 12  $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$  to determine the minutes of operation that are
- 13 equivalent to a day;
- 14 (2)  $\left[\frac{(3)}{(3)}\right]$  defining minutes of operation and
- 15 instructional time; and
- (3)  $[\frac{(4)}{(4)}]$  establishing the minimum number of minutes of
- 17 instructional time required for a full-day and a half-day program
- 18 to meet the time requirements under Subsection (a).
- 19 (e) A school district or education program is exempt from
- 20 the minimum required instructional days or minutes of operation
- 21 [requirement] if the district's or program's average daily
- 22 attendance is calculated under Section 48.005(j).
- 23 (f) The commissioner may proportionally reduce the amount
- 24 of funding a district receives under Chapter 46, 48, or 49 and the
- 25 average daily attendance calculation for the district if the
- 26 district operates on a calendar that provides fewer instructional
- 27 days or minutes of operation than required under Subsection (a).

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- 1 (g) A school district may not provide student instruction on
- 2 Memorial Day. If a school district would be required to provide
- 3 student instruction on Memorial Day to compensate for <u>instructional</u>
- 4 days or minutes of operation [instruction] lost because of school
- 5 closures caused by disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions,
- 6 fuel curtailment, or another calamity, the commissioner shall
- 7 approve the instruction of students for fewer than the number of
- 8 <u>instructional days or</u> minutes <u>of operation</u> required under
- 9 Subsection (a).
- 10 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- 11 amended by adding Section 25.0813 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 25.0813. MAINTENANCE OF FOUR-DAY SCHOOL WEEK SCHEDULE.
- 13 (a) Notwithstanding any other law and except as provided by
- 14 Subsection (b), a school district that adopted a four-day school
- 15 week schedule for the 2022-2023 school year may maintain a four-day
- 16 <u>school week schedule in each subsequent school year.</u>
- 17 (b) If a school district adopts a four-day school week and
- 18 the agency assigns a performance rating of D or F to one or more
- 19 campuses in the district, the district must adopt and maintain a
- 20 five-day school week in each subsequent school year until each
- 21 campus in the district is assigned a performance rating of C or
- 22 higher.
- SECTION 3. Sections 25.0815(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 24 amended to read as follows:
- 25 (a) The commissioner shall provide a waiver allowing for
- 26 fewer instructional days and fewer minutes of operation [and
- 27 instructional time] than required under Section 25.081(a) for a

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- 1 school district that requires each educator employed by the
- 2 district to attend an approved school safety training course.
- 3 (b) A waiver under this section:
- 4 (1) must allow sufficient time for the school
- 5 district's educators to attend the school safety training course;
- 6 and
- 7 (2) may not:
- 8 (A) result in an inadequate number of minutes of
- 9 instructional time for students; or
- 10 (B) reduce<u>:</u>
- (i) the number of instructional days by
- 12 more than one day; or
- 13 (ii) the number of minutes of operation
- 14 [and instructional time] by more than 420 minutes.
- SECTION 4. Section 29.0822(c), Education Code, is amended
- 16 to read as follows:
- 17 (c) Except in the case of a course designed for a student
- 18 described by Subsection (a)(3) or enrolled in a course described by
- 19 Subsection (b)(4), a course offered in a program under this section
- 20 must provide for at least the same number of instructional hours as
- 21 required for a course offered in a program that meets the required
- 22 minimum number of instructional days [minutes of operation] under
- 23 Section 25.081.
- SECTION 5. Section 29.162(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- 26 (a) The commissioner may adopt rules for this subchapter,
- 27 including rules establishing full-day and half-day instructional

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- 1 days and minutes of operation requirements as provided by Section
- 2 25.081.
- 3 SECTION 6. Section 37.011(f), Education Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 (f) A juvenile justice alternative education program must
- 6 operate at least seven hours per day and  $\frac{175}{180}$  [180] days per year,
- 7 except that a program may apply to the Texas Juvenile Justice
- 8 Department for a waiver of the 175-day [180-day] requirement. The
- 9 department may not grant a waiver to a program under this subsection
- 10 for a number of days that exceeds the highest number of
- 11 instructional days waived by the commissioner during the same
- 12 school year for a school district served by the program.
- SECTION 7. Sections 48.005(i), (j), and (m), Education
- 14 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 15 (i) A district or a charter school operating under Chapter
- 16 12 that operates a prekindergarten program is eligible to receive
- 17 one-half of average daily attendance under Subsection (a) if the
- 18 district's or charter school's prekindergarten program provides at
- 19 least 32,400 minutes of instructional time to students over the
- 20 minimum required number of instructional days.
- 21 (j) A district or charter school is eligible to earn full
- 22 average daily attendance under Subsection (a) if the district or
- 23 school provides at least 43,200 minutes of instructional time
- 24 during a school year to students enrolled in:
- 25 (1) a dropout recovery school or program operating
- 26 under Section 12.1141(c) or Section 39.0548;
- 27 (2) an alternative education program operating under

- 1 Section 37.008;
- 2 (3) a school program located at a day treatment
- 3 facility, residential treatment facility, psychiatric hospital, or
- 4 medical hospital;
- 5 (4) a school program offered at a correctional
- 6 facility; or
- 7 (5) a school operating under Subchapter G, Chapter 12.
- 8 (m) The commissioner shall adopt rules necessary to
- 9 implement this section, including rules that:
- 10 (1) establish the minimum amount of instructional time
- 11 per day that allows a school district or charter school to be
- 12 eligible for full average daily attendance, which may differ based
- 13 on the instructional program offered by the district or charter
- 14 school;
- 15 (2) establish the requirements necessary for a school
- 16 district or charter school to be eligible for one-half of average
- 17 daily attendance, which may differ based on the instructional
- 18 program offered by the district or charter school;
- 19 (3) proportionally reduce the average daily
- 20 attendance for a school district if any campus or instructional
- 21 program in the district provides to students fewer than the
- 22 required minimum number of instructional days or minutes of
- 23 operation [instruction to students]; and
- 24 (4) allow a grade or course repeated under Section
- 25 28.02124 to qualify for average daily attendance even if the
- 26 student previously passed or earned credit for the grade or course,
- 27 if the grade or course would otherwise be eligible.

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- 1 SECTION 8. Section 48.0051(a), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The [Subject to Subsection (a-1), the] commissioner
- 4 shall adjust the average daily attendance of a school district or
- 5 open-enrollment charter school under Section 48.005 in the manner
- 6 provided by Subsection (b) if the district or school:
- 7 (1) provides the minimum number of minutes of
- 8 operational and instructional time required under Section 25.081
- 9 and commissioner rules adopted under that section over the minimum
- 10 required number of instructional days or minutes of operation [at
- 11 least 180 days of instruction]; and
- 12 (2) offers an additional 30 days of half-day
- 13 instruction for students enrolled in prekindergarten through fifth
- 14 grade.
- SECTION 9. This Act applies beginning with the 2024-2025
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect on the 91st day after the
- 18 last day of the legislative session.
