Tumberlinson was born in New Haven, Connecticut, on March 27, 1938,

6 and grew up on a farm in San Benito; active in FFA, he won the

7 highest state award, the Lone Star Farmer Degree; upon graduation

8 from Texas A&I University, he was commissioned as a second

9 lieutenant in the U.S. Army; he completed active duty in New Orleans

10 and then served in the reserve for nine years, attaining the rank of

11 captain and commanding the Harlingen reserve unit; and

12 WHEREAS, Mr. Tumberlinson began his civilian career with the

United States Department of Agriculture in Alvin; in 1962, he was

hired to teach science at San Benito Junior High School; he went on

15 to become assistant principal and then served for more than 16 years

16 as principal of San Benito High; together with students and a fellow

17 educator, he designed and planted the line of palm trees in front of

18 the high school; he was business manager for the school district

19 from 1995 until his retirement in 2002; deeply committed to SBCISD,

20 he was a member of the school board for nine years and served as

21 president; his work with students was recognized with Honorary

22 Chapter Farmer and Honorary State FFA Degrees; and

23 WHEREAS, For many years, Mr. Tumberlinson was a member of the

24 Dolly Vinsant Memorial Hospital Board and Scholarship Board, and he

- 3 International; he was active with First Presbyterian Church and
- 4 benefited the congregation as a ruling elder and a building and

- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Tumberlinson was the devoted husband of Sandra
- 7 Tumberlinson; he took great pride in his two children, Janice and
- 8 Robert, from his first marriage to Jahn Locke; an avid outdoorsman,

- 10 vegetable garden, as well as citrus trees that yielded plenty of
