4 November 24, 2023, at the age of 71; and

5           WHEREAS, The son of Eduardo and Josefa Lucio, "Jesse" Lucio  
6 was born in Brownsville on September 3, 1952; he grew up with nine  
7 siblings, Beatrice, Eddie, Bertie, Helen, Maggie, David, Bob, Joe,  
8 and Richard; and

9           WHEREAS, Mr. Lucio taught math in the Brownsville  
10 Independent School District and later became assistant principal at  
11 Sunny Glen Children's Home; in addition, he enjoyed a career as a  
12 golf pro, beginning with a part-time job at the Brownsville Country  
13 Club in 1981; he went on to serve as head coach at The University of  
14 Texas-Brownsville/Texas Southmost College from 1998 to 2004, and he  
15 was employed at the First Tee of Greater Brownsville from 2006 to  
16 2012; and

17           WHEREAS, On July 5, 1996, Mr. Lucio married the love of his  
18 life, Ada Ramirez; the devoted couple raised four children,  
19 Jessica, Jaqueline, Anthony, and Julie, and their treasured family  
20 later grew to include a host of grandchildren; and

21           WHEREAS, Mr. Lucio drew strength from his Christian faith,  
22 and it helped sustain him through such challenges as the death of  
23 his brother, Joe, and his grandson, Baby Jesse; through the years,  
24 he set an inspiring example of compassion and forgiveness, and he

1 was always ready to give someone a second chance or extend a helping  
2 hand to those in need; an avid outdoorsman, he loved fishing,  
3 hunting, sharing sunsets on the boat, and pondering the weather and  
4 the heavens; he had a passion for music and would linger in his car  
5 to savor the final notes of a good song; in addition, he was a loyal  
6 fan of the Dallas Cowboys and Texas Longhorns and found camaraderie  
7 in discussing games with fellow football aficionados; and
