**SB 2572, as Filed by Senator Brandon Creighton  
Texas Commission on Environmental Quality's Comments**

The Legislative Budget Board, in cooperation with the Texas Water Development Board (TWDB) and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), has determined that:

This bill creates Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 229 (the "District") with the powers and duties of a standard municipal utility district under Water Code Chapters 49 and 54

**Comments on Powers/Duties Different from Similar Types of Districts:**

The District must receive consent to the creation of the District from each municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial jurisdiction the District is located prior to holding a confirmation election. The bill requires the TCEQ to appoint the five initial temporary directors upon receipt of a petition from the owners of a majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district. The bill grants the District authority for road projects. The bill allows the District to divide. The bill specifies that at the time of issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of real property in the District. The District may not exercise the power of eminent domain if the bill does not receive a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to each house.

**Overlapping Services:** TCEQ does not have mapping information for water and/or wastewater providers because this function was transferred from the TCEQ to the Public Utility Commission on September 1, 2014. As a result, TCEQ is unaware of possible overlapping service providers.

**TCEQ's Supervision:** As with general law districts, the TCEQ will have general supervisory authority, including bond review authority and review of financial reports.



S.B. No. 2572

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the creation of the Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 229; granting a limited power of eminent domain; providing authority to issue bonds; providing authority to impose fees and taxes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subtitle F, Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Chapter 7970A to read as follows:

CHAPTER 7970A. MONTGOMERY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT

NO. 229

SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Sec. 7970A.0101. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Board" means the district's board of directors.

(2) "Commission" means the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality.

(3) "Director" means a board member.

(4) "District" means the Montgomery County Municipal Utility District No. 229.

Sec. 7970A.0102. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The district is a municipal utility district created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

Sec. 7970A.0103. CONFIRMATION AND DIRECTORS' ELECTION REQUIRED. The temporary directors shall hold an election to confirm the creation of the district and to elect five permanent

1 directors as provided by Section 49.102, Water Code.

2 Sec. 7970A.0104. CONSENT OF MUNICIPALITY REQUIRED. The  
3 temporary directors may not hold an election under Section  
4 7970A.0103 until each municipality in whose corporate limits or  
5 extraterritorial jurisdiction the district is located has  
6 consented by ordinance or resolution to the creation of the  
7 district and to the inclusion of land in the district.

8 Sec. 7970A.0105. FINDINGS OF PUBLIC PURPOSE AND BENEFIT.

9 (a) The district is created to serve a public purpose and benefit.

10 (b) The district is created to accomplish the purposes of:

11 (1) a municipal utility district as provided by  
12 general law and Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution; and

13 (2) Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, that  
14 relate to the construction, acquisition, improvement, operation,  
15 or maintenance of macadamized, graveled, or paved roads, or  
16 improvements, including storm drainage, in aid of those roads.

17 Sec. 7970A.0106. INITIAL DISTRICT TERRITORY. (a) The  
18 district is initially composed of the territory described by  
19 Section 2 of the Act enacting this chapter.

20 (b) The boundaries and field notes contained in Section 2 of  
21 the Act enacting this chapter form a closure. A mistake made in the  
22 field notes or in copying the field notes in the legislative process  
23 does not affect the district's:

24 (1) organization, existence, or validity;

25 (2) right to issue any type of bond for the purposes  
26 for which the district is created or to pay the principal of and  
27 interest on a bond;

1           (3) right to impose a tax; or

2           (4) legality or operation.

3                   SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

4           Sec. 7970A.0201. GOVERNING BODY; TERMS. (a) The district  
5 is governed by a board of five elected directors.

6           (b) Except as provided by Section 7970A.0202, directors  
7 serve staggered four-year terms.

8           Sec. 7970A.0202. TEMPORARY DIRECTORS. (a) On or after  
9 September 1, 2023, the owner or owners of a majority of the assessed  
10 value of the real property in the district may submit a petition to  
11 the commission requesting that the commission appoint as temporary  
12 directors the five persons named in the petition. The commission  
13 shall appoint as temporary directors the five persons named in the  
14 petition.

15           (b) Temporary directors serve until the earlier of:

16                   (1) the date permanent directors are elected under  
17 Section 7970A.0103; or

18                   (2) September 1, 2027.

19           (c) If permanent directors have not been elected under  
20 Section 7970A.0103 and the terms of the temporary directors have  
21 expired, successor temporary directors shall be appointed or  
22 reappointed as provided by Subsection (d) to serve terms that  
23 expire on the earlier of:

24                   (1) the date permanent directors are elected under  
25 Section 7970A.0103; or

26                   (2) the fourth anniversary of the date of the  
27 appointment or reappointment.

1       (d) If Subsection (c) applies, the owner or owners of a  
2 majority of the assessed value of the real property in the district  
3 may submit a petition to the commission requesting that the  
4 commission appoint as successor temporary directors the five  
5 persons named in the petition. The commission shall appoint as  
6 successor temporary directors the five persons named in the  
7 petition.

8                   SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES

9       Sec. 7970A.0301. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The district  
10 has the powers and duties necessary to accomplish the purposes for  
11 which the district is created.

12       Sec. 7970A.0302. MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT POWERS AND  
13 DUTIES. The district has the powers and duties provided by the  
14 general law of this state, including Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code,  
15 applicable to municipal utility districts created under Section 59,  
16 Article XVI, Texas Constitution.

17       Sec. 7970A.0303. AUTHORITY FOR ROAD PROJECTS. Under  
18 Section 52, Article III, Texas Constitution, the district may  
19 design, acquire, construct, finance, issue bonds for, improve,  
20 operate, maintain, and convey to this state, a county, or a  
21 municipality for operation and maintenance macadamized, graveled,  
22 or paved roads, or improvements, including storm drainage, in aid  
23 of those roads.

24       Sec. 7970A.0304. ROAD STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS. (a) A  
25 road project must meet all applicable construction standards,  
26 zoning and subdivision requirements, and regulations of each  
27 municipality in whose corporate limits or extraterritorial

1 jurisdiction the road project is located.

2 (b) If a road project is not located in the corporate limits  
3 or extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality, the road  
4 project must meet all applicable construction standards,  
5 subdivision requirements, and regulations of each county in which  
6 the road project is located.

7 (c) If the state will maintain and operate the road, the  
8 Texas Transportation Commission must approve the plans and  
9 specifications of the road project.

10 Sec. 7970A.0305. COMPLIANCE WITH MUNICIPAL CONSENT  
11 ORDINANCE OR RESOLUTION. The district shall comply with all  
12 applicable requirements of any ordinance or resolution that is  
13 adopted under Section 54.016 or 54.0165, Water Code, and that  
14 consents to the creation of the district or to the inclusion of land  
15 in the district.

16 Sec. 7970A.0306. DIVISION OF DISTRICT. (a) The district  
17 may be divided into two or more new districts only if the district:

18 (1) has no outstanding bonded debt; and

19 (2) is not imposing ad valorem taxes.

20 (b) This chapter applies to any new district created by the  
21 division of the district, and a new district has all the powers and  
22 duties of the district.

23 (c) Any new district created by the division of the district  
24 may not, at the time the new district is created, contain any land  
25 outside the area described by Section 2 of the Act enacting this  
26 chapter.

27 (d) The board, on its own motion or on receipt of a petition

1 signed by the owner or owners of a majority of the assessed value of  
2 the real property in the district, may adopt an order dividing the  
3 district.

4 (e) The board may adopt an order dividing the district  
5 before or after the date the board holds an election under Section  
6 7970A.0103 to confirm the district's creation.

7 (f) An order dividing the district shall:

8 (1) name each new district;

9 (2) include the metes and bounds description of the  
10 territory of each new district;

11 (3) appoint temporary directors for each new district;

12 and

13 (4) provide for the division of assets and liabilities  
14 between or among the new districts.

15 (g) On or before the 30th day after the date of adoption of  
16 an order dividing the district, the district shall file the order  
17 with the commission and record the order in the real property  
18 records of each county in which the district is located.

19 (h) Any new district created by the division of the district  
20 shall hold a confirmation and directors' election as required by  
21 Section 7970A.0103. If the voters of a new district do not confirm  
22 the creation of the new district, the assets, obligations,  
23 territory, and governance of the new district revert to the  
24 original district.

25 (i) If the creation of the new district is confirmed, the  
26 new district shall provide the election date and results to the  
27 commission.

1       (j) Municipal consent to the creation of the district and to  
2 the inclusion of land in the district granted under Section  
3 7970A.0104 acts as municipal consent to the creation of any new  
4 district created by the division of the district and to the  
5 inclusion of land in the new district.

6       (k) Any new district created by the division of the district  
7 must hold an election as required by this chapter to obtain voter  
8 approval before the district may impose a maintenance tax or issue  
9 bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes.

10       (l) This chapter applies to any new district created by the  
11 division of the district, and a new district has all the powers and  
12 duties of the district.

13               SUBCHAPTER D. GENERAL FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

14       Sec. 7970A.0401. ELECTIONS REGARDING TAXES OR BONDS. (a)  
15 The district may issue, without an election, bonds and other  
16 obligations secured by:

17               (1) revenue other than ad valorem taxes; or

18               (2) contract payments described by Section  
19 7970A.0403.

20       (b) The district must hold an election in the manner  
21 provided by Chapters 49 and 54, Water Code, to obtain voter approval  
22 before the district may impose an ad valorem tax or issue bonds  
23 payable from ad valorem taxes.

24       (c) The district may not issue bonds payable from ad valorem  
25 taxes to finance a road project unless the issuance is approved by a  
26 vote of a two-thirds majority of the district voters voting at an  
27 election held for that purpose.

1       Sec. 7970A.0402. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE TAX. (a) If  
2 authorized at an election held under Section 7970A.0401, the  
3 district may impose an operation and maintenance tax on taxable  
4 property in the district in accordance with Section 49.107, Water  
5 Code.

6       (b) The board shall determine the tax rate. The rate may not  
7 exceed the rate approved at the election.

8       Sec. 7970A.0403. CONTRACT TAXES. (a) In accordance with  
9 Section 49.108, Water Code, the district may impose a tax other than  
10 an operation and maintenance tax and use the revenue derived from  
11 the tax to make payments under a contract after the provisions of  
12 the contract have been approved by a majority of the district voters  
13 voting at an election held for that purpose.

14       (b) A contract approved by the district voters may contain a  
15 provision stating that the contract may be modified or amended by  
16 the board without further voter approval.

17               SUBCHAPTER E. BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS

18       Sec. 7970A.0501. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE BONDS AND OTHER  
19 OBLIGATIONS. The district may issue bonds or other obligations  
20 payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, impact fees,  
21 revenue, contract payments, grants, or other district money, or any  
22 combination of those sources, to pay for any authorized district  
23 purpose.

24       Sec. 7970A.0502. TAXES FOR BONDS. At the time the district  
25 issues bonds payable wholly or partly from ad valorem taxes, the  
26 board shall provide for the annual imposition of a continuing  
27 direct ad valorem tax, without limit as to rate or amount, while all

1 or part of the bonds are outstanding as required and in the manner  
2 provided by Sections 54.601 and 54.602, Water Code.

3 Sec. 7970A.0503. BONDS FOR ROAD PROJECTS. At the time of  
4 issuance, the total principal amount of bonds or other obligations  
5 issued or incurred to finance road projects and payable from ad  
6 valorem taxes may not exceed one-fourth of the assessed value of the  
7 real property in the district.

8 SECTION 2. The Montgomery County Municipal Utility District  
9 No. 229 initially includes all the territory contained in the  
10 following area:

11 TRACT 1: BEING a 290.261 acre tract of land situated in the Presley  
12 Gill Survey, Abstract Number 230, and the Thomas J. Williams  
13 Survey, Abstract Number 593, Montgomery County, Texas, being a the  
14 remainder of a called 320.348 acre tract described as "Parcel 2,  
15 Tract 4", all of that tract described as "Parcel 1, Tract X", and  
16 all of that certain called 45.615 acre tract described as "Parcel 2,  
17 Tract 7", all in instrument to Atakapa, LLC., recorded under  
18 Clerk's File Number 2013016070 of the Official Public Records of  
19 Montgomery County, Texas, (O.P.R.M.C.T.), said 290.261 acre tract  
20 being more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:
