1 Amend C.S.H.B. 1605 (house committee printing) as follows:

2 (1) On page 40, line 27, strike "an allotment under Section  
3 48.158" and substitute "additional state aid under Section 48.308".

4 (2) Strike page 48, line 11, through page 51, line 9, and  
5 substitute the following appropriately numbered SECTION:

6 SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. Subchapter G, Chapter 48, Education Code, is  
7 amended by adding Sections 48.307 and 48.308 to read as follows:

8 Sec. 48.307. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR STATE-APPROVED  
9 INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS. (a) For each student enrolled in the  
10 district, a school district is entitled to additional state aid for  
11 each school year in an amount equal to \$40, or a greater amount  
12 provided by appropriation, to procure instructional material that  
13 has been:

14 (1) reviewed by the agency under Section 31.023;

15 (2) placed on the list of approved instructional  
16 materials maintained by the State Board of Education under Section  
17 31.022;

18 (3) designated by the State Board of Education under  
19 Section 31.022 as being included or capable of being included in an  
20 instructional materials parent portal under Section 31.154; and

21 (4) acquired from a publisher, manufacturer, or other  
22 entity that has not been found to violate Section 31.151.

23 (b) A school district is entitled to the amount of state aid  
24 provided by Subsection (a) each school year, regardless of whether  
25 the district uses the amount during the school year for which the  
26 amount was provided.

27 (c) Additional state aid provided under this section shall  
28 be deposited to the credit of the district's instructional  
29 materials and technology account maintained by the commissioner

1 under Section 31.0212 and may be accessed only for the procurement  
2 of instructional materials in accordance with this section.

3 (d) Funds provided to a school district under this section  
4 must be spent in compliance with the requirements for the use of  
5 funds provided under this section and Section 31.0211.

6 Sec. 48.308. ADDITIONAL STATE AID FOR OPEN EDUCATION  
7 RESOURCE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIAL. (a) Subject to Section 31.0751,  
8 a school district is entitled to additional state aid for each  
9 school year in an amount not to exceed \$20 for each student for the  
10 costs incurred or for which the district is obligated to pay during  
11 the school year in which the aid is provided for the printing and  
12 shipping of open education resource instructional material made  
13 available under Subchapter B-1, Chapter 31.

14 (b) The amount to which a school district is entitled under  
15 this section may not exceed actual costs incurred by the district or  
16 for which the district is obligated to pay during the school year  
17 for which the funds were provided.

18 (c) Additional state aid provided under this section shall  
19 be deposited to the credit of the district's instructional  
20 materials and technology account maintained by the commissioner  
21 under Section 31.0212 and may be accessed only for the procurement  
22 of instructional materials in accordance with this section.

23 (d) Funds provided to a school district under this section  
24 must be spent in compliance with the requirements for the use of  
25 funds provided under this section and Section 31.0211.

26 (3) Add the following appropriately numbered SECTION to the  
27 bill and renumber subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly:

28 SECTION \_\_\_\_\_. Section 48.277(b), Education Code, is amended  
29 to read as follows:

30 (b) For purposes of calculating maintenance and operations  
31 revenue under Subsection (a), the commissioner shall:

1 (1) for purposes of Subsections (a)(1) and (2), use  
2 the following applicable school year:

3 (A) in a school year ending in an even-numbered  
4 year, the 2019-2020 school year; and

5 (B) in a school year ending in an odd-numbered  
6 year, the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 school year, whichever is greater;

7 (2) include all state and local funding, except for  
8 any funding resulting from:

9 (A) reimbursement for disaster remediation costs  
10 under former Sections 41.0931 and 42.2524;

11 (B) an adjustment for rapid decline in taxable  
12 value of property under former Section 42.2521; ~~and~~

13 (C) an adjustment for property value affected by  
14 a state of disaster under former Section 42.2523; and

15 (D) additional state aid under Section 48.307 or  
16 48.308;

17 (3) adjust the calculation to reflect a reduction in  
18 tax effort by a school district; and

19 (4) if a school district or open-enrollment charter  
20 school receives a waiver relating to eligibility requirements for  
21 the national free or reduced-price lunch program under 42 U.S.C.  
22 Section 1751 et seq., use the numbers of educationally  
23 disadvantaged students on which the district's or school's  
24 entitlement to compensatory education funds was based for the  
25 school year before the school year in which the district or school  
26 received the waiver, adjusted for estimated enrollment growth.

27 (4) On page 52, lines 23 and 24, strike "Sections 48.157 and  
28 48.158, Education Code, as added by this Act" and substitute  
29 "Sections 48.307 and 48.308, Education Code, as added by this Act,  
30 and Section 48.277(b), Education Code, as amended by this Act".
