

FLOOR AMENDMENT NO. \_\_\_\_\_ BY: Bell of Kaufwan

Amend C.S.S.B. No. 9 (house committee report) by adding the 2 following appropriately numbered SECTIONS to the bill and renumbering subsequent SECTIONS of the bill accordingly: 4 SECTION \_\_\_\_. Section 11.1511(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: (b) The board shall: 6 7 (1) seek to establish working relationships with other public entities to make effective use of community resources and to serve the needs of public school students in the community; 10 adopt a vision statement and comprehensive goals for the district and the superintendent and monitor progress toward 11 12 those goals; 13 establish performance goals for the district 14 concerning: 15 (A) the academic and fiscal performance 16 indicators under Subchapters C, D, and J, Chapter 39; and 17 (B) any performance indicators adopted by the district; 18 19 (4)ensure that the superintendent: 20 (A) is accountable for achieving performance 21 results; 22 recognizes performance accomplishments; and (B) 23 takes action as necessary to meet performance 24 goals; adopt a policy to establish a district- and 25 campus-level planning and decision-making process as required 26 under Section 11.251; 27 28 publish an annual educational performance report

as required under Section 39.306;

- 1 (7) adopt an annual budget for the district as
- 2 required under Section 44.004;
- 3 (8) adopt a tax rate each fiscal year as required under
- 4 Section 26.05, Tax Code;
- 5 (9) monitor district finances to ensure that the
- 6 superintendent is properly maintaining the district's financial
- 7 procedures and records;
- 8 (10) ensure that district fiscal accounts are audited
- 9 annually as required under Section 44.008;
- 10 (11) publish an end-of-year financial report for
- 11 distribution to the community;
- 12 (12) conduct elections as required by law;
- 13 (13) by rule, adopt a process through which district
- 14 personnel, students or the parents or guardians of students, and
- 15 members of the public may file a complaint and obtain a hearing from
- 16 the district administrators and the board regarding  $\underline{\text{the}}$  [ $\underline{\textbf{a}}$ ]
- 17 complaint that must:
- (A) allow a complaint to be filed at any time
- 19 regardless of when the conduct initially giving rise to the
- 20 complaint occurred if the complaint alleges a violation of law or
- 21 board policy that is continuous or ongoing;
- (B) unless otherwise provided by law, include:
- (i) an initial administrative hearing; and
- 24 <u>(ii) an opportunity to appeal the</u>
- 25 <u>administrative decision following the initial hearing;</u>
- (C) unless otherwise agreed to by the parties,
- 27 provide for a final decision on the complaint not later than 120
- 28 calendar days after the date on which the complaint was filed; and
- (D) if a final decision on a complaint is not
- 30 rendered before the 120th day after the date on which the complaint
- 31 was filed, require the district to immediately render a final

- decision on the complaint in favor of the complainant;
- 2 (14) make decisions relating to terminating the
- 3 employment of district employees employed under a contract to which
- 4 Chapter 21 applies, including terminating or not renewing an
- 5 employment contract to which that chapter applies; and
- 6 (15) carry out other powers and duties as provided by
- 7 this code or other law.
- 8 SECTION \_\_\_\_. The board of trustees of a school district
- 9 shall adopt a process for filing a complaint and obtaining a hearing
- 10 in accordance with Section 11.1511(b), Education Code, as amended
- 11 by this Act, as soon as practicable after September 1, 2023.
