4	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 52A to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 52A. SICKLE CELL DISEASE REGISTRY
7	Sec. 52A.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "health care
8	facility" means:
9	(1) a hospital licensed under Chapter 241; or
10	(2) any other facility that provides diagnostic or
11	treatment services to patients with sickle cell disease.
12	Sec. 52A.002. REGISTRY; CONTENTS. (a) The department shall
13	establish and maintain a sickle cell disease registry in accordance
14	with this chapter for use as a single repository of accurate,
15	complete records of cases of sickle cell disease to aid in the cure
16	and treatment of sickle cell disease in this state.
17	(b) The sickle cell disease registry must include:
18	(1) a record of cases of sickle cell disease that occur
19	in this state; and
20	(2) any other information concerning cases of sickle
21	cell disease that the executive commissioner considers necessary
22	and appropriate for the cure or treatment of sickle cell disease.
23	Sec. 52A.003. DATA FROM HEALTH CARE FACILITIES. A health
24	care facility shall provide to the department, in the form and

H.B. No. 181 manner prescribed by the department, data the department considers 1 2 necessary and appropriate concerning cases of sickle cell disease. Sec. 52A.004. DEPARTMENT POWERS; RULES. (a) To implement 3 this chapter, the department may: 4 5 execute necessary contracts; 6 (2) receive data from health care facilities 7 concerning cases of sickle cell disease to record and analyze the data directly related to the disease; and 8 9 (3) compile and publish statistical and other studies derived from data obtained under this chapter to provide, in an 10 accessible form, information that is useful to physicians, other 11 12 medical personnel, and the public. (b) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules as 13 14 necessary to implement this chapter. 15 (c) The executive commissioner by rule shall develop 16 guidelines to: 17 (1) obtain information from health care facilities regarding cases of sickle cell disease; 18 (2) protect the confidentiality of individuals 19 diagnosed with sickle cell disease in accordance with Section 20 159.002, Occupations Code; and 21 22 (3) ensure that the registry is developed in a manner consistent with: 23 24 (A) the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (Pub. L. No. 104-191); 25 26 (B) regulations adopted under that Act; and 27 (C) other applicable laws and regulations

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1	governing disclosure of health information.
2	Sec. 52A.005. REPORTS. (a) The department shall submit an
3	annual report to the legislature of the information obtained under
4	this chapter.
5	(b) The department, in cooperation with other sickle cell
6	disease reporting organizations and research institutions, may
7	publish reports the department determines are necessary to carry
8	out the purposes of this chapter.
9	SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date
10	of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human
11	Services Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement
12	Chapter 52A, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act.
13	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
