1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring a voter to be affiliated with a political
3	party to vote in that party's primary election or otherwise
4	participate in that party's affairs; creating a criminal offense.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 13.002(c), Election Code, is amended to
7	read as follows:
8	(c) A registration application must include:
9	(1) the applicant's first name, middle name, if any,
10	last name, and former name, if any;
11	(2) the month, day, and year of the applicant's birth;
12	(3) a statement that the applicant is a United States
13	citizen;
14	(4) a statement that the applicant is a resident of the
15	county;
16	(5) a statement that the applicant has not been
17	determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate
18	jurisdiction to be:

- 19 (A) totally mentally incapacitated; or
- 20 (B) partially mentally incapacitated without the
- 21 right to vote;
- 22 (6) a statement that the applicant has not been
- 23 finally convicted of a felony or that the applicant is a felon
- 24 eligible for registration under Section 13.001;

- 1 (7) the applicant's residence address or, if the
- 2 residence has no address, the address at which the applicant
- 3 receives mail and a concise description of the location of the
- 4 applicant's residence;
- 5 (8) the following information:
- 6 (A) the applicant's Texas driver's license number
- 7 or the number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 8 Department of Public Safety;
- 9 (B) if the applicant has not been issued a number
- 10 described by Paragraph (A), the last four digits of the applicant's
- 11 social security number; or
- 12 (C) a statement by the applicant that the
- 13 applicant has not been issued a number described by Paragraph (A) or
- 14 (B);
- 15 (9) if the application is made by an agent, a statement
- 16 of the agent's relationship to the applicant; [and]
- 17 (10) the city and county in which the applicant
- 18 formerly resided; and
- 19 <u>(11)</u> the applicant's political party affiliation, if
- 20 <u>any</u>.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 13.122(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- 23 (a) In addition to the other statements and spaces for
- 24 entering information that appear on an officially prescribed
- 25 registration application form, each official form must include:
- 26 (1) the statement: "I understand that giving false
- 27 information to procure a voter registration is perjury and a crime

- 1 under state and federal law.";
- 2 (2) a space for the applicant's registration number;
- 3 (3) a space for the applicant's Texas driver's license
- 4 number or number of a personal identification card issued by the
- 5 Department of Public Safety;
- 6 (4) a space for the applicant's telephone number;
- 7 (5) a space for the applicant's social security
- 8 number;
- 9 (6) a space for the applicant's sex;
- 10 (7) a statement indicating that the furnishing of the
- 11 applicant's telephone number and sex is optional;
- 12 (8) a space or box for indicating whether the
- 13 applicant or voter is submitting new registration information or a
- 14 change in current registration information;
- 15 (9) a statement instructing a voter who is using the
- 16 form to make a change in current registration information to enter
- 17 the voter's name and the changed information in the appropriate
- 18 spaces on the form;
- 19 (10) a statement that if the applicant declines to
- 20 register to vote, that fact will remain confidential and will be
- 21 used only for voter registration purposes;
- 22 (11) a statement that if the applicant does register
- 23 to vote, information regarding the agency or office to which the
- 24 application is submitted will remain confidential and will be used
- 25 only for voter registration purposes;
- 26 (12) a space or box for indicating whether the
- 27 applicant is interested in working as an election judge;

- 1 (13) a statement warning that a conviction for making
- 2 a false statement may result in imprisonment for up to the maximum
- 3 amount of time provided by law, a fine of up to the maximum amount
- 4 provided by law, or both the imprisonment and the fine; [and]
- 5 (14) a space for the applicant's political party
- 6 affiliation; and
- 7 (15) any other voter registration information
- 8 required by federal law or considered appropriate and required by
- 9 the secretary of state.
- 10 SECTION 3. Section 14.001, Election Code, is amended by
- 11 adding Subsections (e) and (f) to read as follows:
- 12 (e) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the registrar may not
- 13 <u>issue a renewal certificate to a voter before December 31, 2023,</u>
- 14 unless the voter's political party affiliation, if any, appears on
- 15 the list described by Section 18.005(a). The registrar must issue a
- 16 renewal certificate to each voter entitled to a renewal certificate
- 17 under this section not later than January 20, 2024. This subsection
- 18 expires January 31, 2024.
- 19 (f) A renewal certificate issued in January 2024 is
- 20 considered to have been issued in the prior year for purposes of
- 21 Subsection (c). This subsection expires December 31, 2025.
- SECTION 4. Section 15.001(a), Election Code, is amended to
- 23 read as follows:
- 24 (a) Each voter registration certificate issued must
- 25 contain:
- 26 (1) the voter's name in the form indicated by the
- 27 voter, subject to applicable requirements prescribed by Section

- 1 13.002 and by rule of the secretary of state;
- 2 (2) the voter's residence address or, if the residence
- 3 has no address, the address at which the voter receives mail and a
- 4 concise description of the location of the voter's residence;
- 5 (3) the year of the voter's birth;
- 6 (4) the number of the county election precinct in
- 7 which the voter resides;
- 8 (5) the voter's effective date of registration if an
- 9 initial certificate;
- 10 (6) the voter's registration number;
- 11 (7) an indication of the period for which the
- 12 certificate is issued;
- 13 (8) a statement explaining the circumstances under
- 14 which the voter will receive a new certificate;
- 15 (9) a space for <u>indicating</u> [stamping] the voter's
- 16 political party affiliation;
- 17 (10) a statement that voting with the certificate by a
- 18 person other than the person in whose name the certificate is issued
- 19 is a felony;
- 20 (11) a space for the voter's signature;
- 21 (12) a statement that the voter must sign the
- 22 certificate personally, if able to sign, immediately on receipt;
- 23 (13) a space for the voter to correct the information
- 24 on the certificate followed by a signature line;
- 25 (14) the statement: "If any information on this
- 26 certificate changes or is incorrect, correct the information in the
- 27 space provided, sign below, and return this certificate to the

- 21 SECTION 11. Section 142.009, Election Code, is amended to
- 22 read as follows:
- Sec. 142.009. PETITION TO BE CIRCULATED AFTER PRIMARY. A
- 24 signature on a candidate's petition is invalid if the signer:
- 25 (1) signed the petition on or before general primary
- 26 election day or, if a runoff primary is held for the office sought
- 27 by the candidate, on or before runoff primary election day; or

- 1 (2) is affiliated with a political party that holds a
- 2 primary election [voted in the general or runoff primary election
- 3 of a political party that made a nomination, at either primary, for
- 4 the office sought by the candidate].
- 5 SECTION 12. Section 161.005(a), Election Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (a) To be eligible to be a candidate for or to serve as an
- 8 officer of a political party, a person must:
- 9 (1) except as provided by Subsection (c), not be a
- 10 candidate for nomination or election to, or be the holder of, an
- 11 elective office of the federal, state, or county government; and
- 12 (2) if the office is a county or precinct chair of a
- 13 political party, be a qualified voter of the county and be
- 14 affiliated with that political party.
- SECTION 13. Section 162.001(a), Election Code, is amended

- 17 (a) A person must be affiliated with a political party to be
- 18 eligible:
- 19 (1) to serve as a delegate to or otherwise participate

- 2 (7) to be a presidential elector for the political

- 4 (8)  $\left[\frac{(4)}{(4)}\right]$  for any other purpose within the party as
- 5 adopted by state party rules.
- 6 SECTION 14. Section 162.003, Election Code, is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 162.003. AFFILIATION PROCEDURE [BY VOTING IN PRIMARY].
- 9 (a) A person becomes affiliated with a political party by notifying
- 10 the registrar of the person's affiliation [when the person:
- 11 [(1) is accepted to vote in the party's primary
- 12 election; or
- 13 [(2) returns an early voting or limited primary ballot
- 14 voted by mail].
- 15 (b) At the time a person registers to vote the person may:
- 16 (1) affiliate with a political party that holds a
- 17 primary election or a political party that makes its nominations by
- 18 convention regardless of whether the party has a state
- 19 organization; or
- 20 (2) indicate no affiliation with any political party.
- 21 (c) Affiliation under Subsection (b)(1) takes effect on the
- 22 <u>first anniversary of the date the person submits a registration</u>
- 23 <u>application to the registrar.</u>
- 24 (d) A registered voter who does not indicate an affiliation
- 25 with a political party of this state shall be listed as
- 26 "independent" on the voter's registration certificate and on the
- 27 list of registered voters.

- 1 (e) A registered voter may change the voter's affiliation
- 2 status by notifying the registrar as provided by Section 15.021.
- 3 The change becomes effective on the first anniversary of the date
- 4 the voter submits notice of the change to the registrar under
- 5 Section 15.021.
- 6 (f) A person may also indicate a party affiliation at the
- 7 time the person submits a federal postcard application under
- 8 Chapter 101. The affiliation takes effect at the time provided for
- 9 a change under Subsection (e).
- 10 (g) The secretary of state shall prescribe any additional
- 11 procedures necessary to implement this section.
- (h) Notwithstanding Subsection (c), if a person is 18 years
- 13 of age or younger at the time the person registers to vote,
- 14 affiliation under Subsection (b)(1) takes effect on the first
- 15 <u>election at which the person is eligible to vote following the</u>
- 16 <u>submission of the registration application.</u>
- (i) Notwithstanding Subsections (c) and (e), if a person
- 18 notifies the registrar of the person's affiliation not later than
- 19 December 31, 2023, the affiliation takes effect on the first
- 20 election at which the person is eligible to vote following the
- 21 submission of the registration application or change, as
- 22 applicable. This subsection expires December 31, 2024.
- SECTION 15. Section 162.010(a), Election Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (a) A [Except as provided by Subsection (b), a] party
- 26 affiliation expires on cancellation of a voter's registration or at
- 27 the time a change in affiliation takes effect under Section 162.003

- 1 [at the end of the voting year in which the person became
- 2 affiliated].
- 3 SECTION 16. Section 162.013, Election Code, is amended to
- 4 read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 162.013. VOID VOTE. A vote in a primary election is
- 6 void if the voter is not affiliated with the political party holding
- 7 the primary [previously voted in a primary election of another
- 8 party or participated in a convention of another party during the
- 9 same voting year].
- 10 SECTION 17. Sections 162.014(a), (c), and (d), Election
- 11 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 12 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly
- 13 votes or attempts to vote in a primary election or participates or
- 14 attempts to participate in a convention of a party without being
- 15 <u>affiliated</u> with that party [after having voted in a primary
- 16 election or participated in a convention of another party during
- 17 the same voting year].
- 18 (c) An offense under this section is a felony of the second
- 19 degree if the conduct constituting an offense under Subsection (a)
- 20 consists of knowingly voting in a primary election without being
- 21 affiliated with that party [after having voted in a primary
- 22 election of another party during the same voting year].
- 23 (d) An offense under this section is a state jail felony if
- 24 the conduct constituting an offense under Subsection (a) consists
- 25 of knowingly attempting to vote in a primary election without being
- 26 affiliated with that party [after having voted in a primary
- 27 election of another party during the same voting year].

- SECTION 18. Section 162.017(e), Election Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (e) The preregistration process must [include the statement
- 4 described by Section 162.004(a) and require a preregistering
- 5 attendee to be affiliated [affiliate] with the party [by taking the
- 6 oath described in Section 162.007(b)].
- 7 SECTION 19. Section 172.021, Election Code, is amended by
- 8 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (b-3) and (h) to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (b) <u>In [An application must, in]</u> addition to complying with
- 11 Section 141.031, an application must:
- 12 (1) indicate that, at the time of the application, the
- 13 applicant is affiliated with the political party whose nomination
- 14 for office the candidate seeks; and
- 15 (2) be accompanied by the appropriate filing fee or a
- 16 petition in lieu of the filing fee that satisfies the requirements
- 17 prescribed by Section 141.062. [A political party may not require
- 18 payment of a fee as a condition to applying for a place on the ballot
- 19 as a candidate for county chair or precinct chair.
- 20 (b-3) A political party may not require payment of a fee
- 21 under this section as a condition to applying for a place on the
- 22 ballot as a candidate for county chair or precinct chair.
- 23 (h) A signature on a petition under this section is not
- 24 valid if at the time of signing the signer is affiliated with a
- 25 political party other than the party whose nomination for office
- 26 the candidate seeks. A signature on a petition under this section
- 27 is valid if at the time of signing the signer is unaffiliated with a

- 2 SECTION 20. Section 172.026, Election Code, is amended to
- 3 read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 172.026. RESTRICTION ON PETITION SIGNER. On signing a
- 5 petition to be filed under Section 172.021, the signer becomes
- 6 ineligible to <u>affiliate with</u> [vote in a primary election or
- 7 participate in a convention of] another political party during the
- 8 voting year in which the primary election is held.
- 9 SECTION 21. Section 172.027, Election Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 172.027. STATEMENT ON PETITION. The following

- 4 SECTION 23. Section 172.088(c), Election Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (c) A petition signer may not at the time of signing be
- 7 <u>affiliated with another political party</u>. A political party by rule
- 8 may provide for permitting voters who are not affiliated with any
- 9 political party to be eligible to sign a petition under this section
- 10 [restricting petition signers on the basis of party alignment or
- 11 preference].
- 12 SECTION 24. Subchapter E, Chapter 172, Election Code, is
- 13 amended by adding Section 172.1115 to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 172.1115. AFFILIATION WITH PARTY REQUIRED. (a) The
- 15 signature roster for a primary election must state at the top of
- 16 <u>each page: "A person commits a criminal offense if the person</u>
- 17 knowingly votes in a primary election or participates in a
- 18 convention of a party without being affiliated with that party."
- (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a person may not
- 20 be accepted for voting in a primary election of a political party
- 21 unless:
- 22 (1) the list of registered voters indicates that the
- 23 person is affiliated with that political party; or
- 24 (2) the voter's registration certificate indicates
- 25 that the voter is affiliated with that political party.
- 26 (c) A person who seeks to vote in a primary election but
- 27 cannot establish the person's party affiliation under Subsection

- 1 (b) may be accepted only for provisional voting under Section
- 2 63.011.
- 3 SECTION 25. Section 172.126(g), Election Code, is amended
- 4 to read as follows:
- 5 (g) A separate set of ballot boxes or other suitable
- 6 containers approved by the secretary of state shall be used for each
- 7 party's primary, except that one set of ballot boxes or other
- 8 containers may be used in a joint primary using an electronic voting
- 9 system in which the ballots are deposited by the voters directly
- 10 into a unit of automatic tabulating equipment. [The lists of
- 11 registered voters and the voters' registration certificates shall
- 12 be marked and stamped to show the appropriate party affiliation for
- 13 each voter. A separate list of registered voters shall be used for
- 14 each party's primary. The secretary of state by rule shall
- 15 prescribe requirements to ensure that one party's ballot is readily
- 16 distinguished from another's, which may include the use of
- 17 different colors of ink.
- SECTION 26. Sections 181.006(f) and (g), Election Code, are
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (f) The following statement must appear at the top of each
- 21 page of the petition: "I know that the purpose of this petition is
- 22 to entitle the \_\_\_\_\_ Party to have its nominees placed on the
- 23 ballot in the general election for state and county officers. I am
- 24 not affiliated with another political party. [I have not voted in a
- 25 primary election or participated in a convention of another party
- 26 during this voting year, and I understand that I become ineligible
- 27 to do so by signing this petition. I understand that signing more

- 1 than one petition to entitle a party to have its nominees placed on
- 2 the general election ballot in the same election is prohibited."
- 3 (g) A person who is affiliated with another political party
- 4 [has voted in a primary election or participated in a convention of
- 5 another party during the voting year in which the petition is
- 6 circulated] is ineligible to sign the petition, and the signature
- 7 of such a person is invalid.
- 8 SECTION 27. Section 181.031(a), Election Code, is amended
- 9 to read as follows:
- 10 (a) To be entitled to be considered for nomination by a
- 11 convention held under this chapter, a person must:
- 12 (1) make an application for nomination; and
- 13 (2) be affiliated with the political party whose
- 14 nomination for office the candidate seeks.
- 15 SECTION 28. Section 181.065, Election Code, is amended to
- 16 read as follows:
- 17 Sec. 181.065. PARTICIPANT TO BE AFFILIATED WITH PARTY
- 18 [REGISTERED VOTER]. To be eligible to participate in a precinct
- 19 convention held under this chapter, a person must be affiliated
- 20 with the political party [a registered voter of the precinct or a
- 21 precinct resident who is eligible to vote a limited ballot].
- SECTION 29. Section 182.0041(a), Election Code, is amended
- 23 to read as follows:
- 24 (a) To be entitled to be considered for nomination by a
- 25 convention held under this chapter, a person must:
- 26 (1) make an application for nomination; and
- 27 (2) be affiliated with the political party whose

- 1 <u>nomination for office the candidate seeks</u>.
- 2 SECTION 30. Sections 192.032(f) and (g), Election Code, are
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (f) The following statement must appear at the top of each
- 5 page of the petition: "I am not affiliated with a political party
- 6 that has held [did not vote this year in] a presidential primary
- 7 election this year."
- 8 (g) A signature on the petition is invalid if the signer:
- 9 (1) signs the petition on or before the date of the
- 10 presidential primary election in the presidential election year; or
- 11 (2) <u>is affiliated with a political party that has held</u>
- 12 [voted in] a presidential primary election during the presidential
- 13 election year.
- 14 SECTION 31. Section 203.011, Election Code, is amended to
- 15 read as follows:
- Sec. 203.011. PARTY ALIGNMENT ON BALLOT. The party
- 17 alignment of each candidate shall be printed on the official ballot
- 18 next to the candidate's name. If a candidate is affiliated with a
- 19 political party, that party shall be printed next to the
- 20 candidate's name regardless of the party alignment provided on the
- 21 application under Section 203.005(b).
- 22 SECTION 32. Sections 162.001(b), 162.004, 162.005,
- 23 162.006, 162.007, 162.008, 162.009, 162.010(b), 162.011, 162.012,
- 24 172.1141, 172.115(c), and 172.125, Election Code, are repealed.
- 25 SECTION 33. (a) Not later than October 1, 2023, the voter
- 26 registrar of each county shall mail to each registered voter in the
- 27 county notice of the affiliation requirement necessary to vote in a

- 1 party primary election or to participate in the affairs of a
- 2 political party. The notice must:
- 3 (1) inform the voter that to vote in a party primary
- 4 election or to otherwise participate in the affairs of a political
- 5 party the voter must be affiliated with that party;
- 6 (2) inform the voter of the process of affiliation
- 7 with the voter registrar and state that if a voter does not provide
- 8 an affiliation, the voter's next registration certificate will
- 9 indicate that the voter is "independent" and unable to vote in a
- 10 party's primary;
- 11 (3) include a postage paid postcard that may be
- 12 returned to the voter registrar to indicate the voter's
- 13 affiliation; and
- 14 (4) be in the form prescribed by the secretary of
- 15 state.
- 16 (b) If a registered voter does not indicate a party
