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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to waivers for state park entrance fees and hunting and 3 fishing license fees for certain resident first responders. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 13.015, Parks and Wildlife Code, 5 is amended by amending Subsection (a-2) and adding Subsection (a-3) to 6 read as follows: 7 (a-2) The department shall waive the park entrance fee for a 8 resident as defined by Section 42.001 who is a first responder as 9 defined by Section 42.012 and who: 10 11 (1) has completed at least 20 years of continuous 12 service as a first responder; or 13 (2) has a disability connected to service as a first 14 responder consisting of the loss of the use of a lower extremity or of a disability rating of 50 percent or more. 15 16 (a-3) The department may promote visits and enhance revenue at parks, including amounts necessary for salaries, advertising, 17 consumable supplies and materials, promotional products, fees, and 18 related expenses. 19 SECTION 2. Section 42.012, Parks and Wildlife Code, 20 is 21 amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to 22 read as follows: 23 (c) The commission shall waive the fee or license 24 requirement for a resident who is a first responder who:

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1	(1) has completed at least 20 years of continuous
2	service as a first responder; or
3	(2) has a disability connected to service as a first
4	responder consisting of the loss of the use of a lower extremity or
5	of a disability rating of 50 percent or more.
6	(d) In this section:
7	(1) "First responder" means:
8	(A) a firefighter certified by the Texas
9	Commission on Fire Protection or by the State Firefighters' and
10	Fire Marshals' Association of Texas;
11	(B) an individual certified as emergency medical
12	services personnel by the Department of State Health Services;
13	(C) a municipal police officer;
14	(D) a sheriff, deputy sheriff, or reserve deputy
15	sheriff; or
16	(E) a constable, deputy constable, or reserve
17	deputy constable.
18	(2) "Qualified veteran with a disability" means a
19	veteran with a service connected disability, as defined by the
20	United States Department of Veterans Affairs, consisting of the
21	loss of the use of a lower extremity or of a disability rating of 50
22	percent or more and who is receiving compensation from the United
23	States for the disability.
24	SECTION 3. Section 46.004(c), Parks and Wildlife Code, is
25	amended to read as follows:
26	(c) The commission shall waive the fee for:
27	(1) a qualified veteran with a disability as defined

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1	by Section 42.012 <u>;</u>
2	(2) [and for] a resident on active duty as a member of
3	the United States military forces, the Texas Army National Guard,
4	the Texas Air National Guard, or the Texas State Guard <u>; and</u>
5	(3) a resident who is a first responder as defined by
6	Section 42.012 and who:
7	(A) has completed at least 20 years of continuous
8	service as a first responder; or
9	(B) has a disability connected to service as a
10	first responder consisting of the loss of the use of a lower
11	extremity or of a disability rating of 50 percent or more.
12	SECTION 4. Section 50.002, Parks and Wildlife Code, is
13	amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
14	(c) The commission shall waive the fee for an annual
15	combination resident hunting and fishing license for a resident
16	who is a first responder as defined by Section 42.012 and who:
17	(1) has completed at least 20 years of continuous
18	service as a first responder; or
19	(2) has a disability connected to service as a first
20	responder consisting of the loss of the use of a lower extremity or
21	of a disability rating of 50 percent or more.
22	SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
