This chapter applies only to eligible survivors of the following individuals: 8 (1) an individual: 9 (A) elected, appointed, or employed as a peace 10 officer by the state or a political subdivision of the state under 11 12 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, or other law; or 13 (B) employed as a peace officer by a private 14 institution of higher education, including a private junior college, that is located in this state under Section 51.212, 15 Education Code; 16 (2) a paid probation officer appointed by the director 17 of a community supervision and corrections department who has the 18 duties set out in Section 76.002 and the qualifications set out in 19 20 Section 76.005, or who was appointed in accordance with prior law; 21 (3) a parole officer employed by the Texas Department 22 of Criminal Justice who has the duties set out in Section 508.001 23 and the qualifications set out in Section 508.113 or in prior law; 24 (4) a paid jailer;

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1 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act relating to the death of a member of the Texas military forces applies only 2 in relation to a death that occurs on or after the effective date of 3 this Act. Matters regarding eligibility, payment, and benefits 4 5 under Chapter 615, Government Code, in relation to a death that occurs before the effective date of this Act are governed by the law 6 in effect on the date the death occurs, and the former law is 7 8 continued in effect for that purpose.

Notwithstanding Subsection (a) of this section, the 9 (b) 10 change in law made by this Act applies in relation to the death of a member of the Texas military forces that occurs on or after May 31, 11 2021, if the member died while serving on state active duty as a 12 result of the disaster declaration issued by the governor under 13 14 Section 418.014, Government Code, relating to a surge of 15 individuals unlawfully crossing the Texas-Mexico border.

16 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
