11	executive or local order issued under Chapter 418 during a declared
12	state of disaster.
13	(2) "Governmental entity" means the state or a
14	political subdivision of the state.
15	Sec. 2010.002. COMPENSATION FOR GOVERNMENTAL ACTION. (a)
16	Except as provided by Subsection (b), a business owner is entitled
17	to compensation from a governmental entity for losses caused to the
18	owner's business by a governmental action taken by the governmental
19	entity that:
20	(1) closes a business permanently or temporarily; or
21	(2) effectively closes a business by:
22	(A) limiting the business's operations to the
23	extent that the business owner cannot effectively maintain the

1	(B) ordering customers not to patronize the
2	business.
3	(b) A business owner is not entitled to compensation under
4	Subsection (a) if the governmental entity can demonstrate that the
5	primary reason for the governmental action was:
6	(1) a judicial finding that the business:
7	(A) was a nuisance under Chapter 125, Civil
8	Practice and Remedies Code, Chapter 341 or 343, Health and Safety
9	Code, or common law; or
10	(B) violated other law; or
11	(2) a finding that the business or owner failed to:
12	(A) acquire or maintain a license required by the
13	governmental entity for the business;
14	(B) file or maintain records required by the
15	secretary of state; or
16	(C) pay taxes.
17	Sec. 2010.003. ACTION AGAINST GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY. (a) A
18	business owner may bring an action against a governmental entity
19	for compensation for damages caused to the business by a
20	governmental action described by Section 2010.002.
21	(b) An action under this chapter may be brought in a
22	district court in any county in which the business is located.
23	Sec. 2010.004. WAIVER OF GOVERNMENTAL IMMUNITY; PERMISSION
24	TO SUE. (a) Sovereign and governmental immunity to suit and from
25	liability is waived and abolished to the extent of liability
26	created by this chapter.
27	(b) This section does not authorize a person to execute a

1 judgment against property of the governmental entity.

2 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to 3 a governmental action taken on or after the effective date of this 4 Act.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
