CONTINUING EDUCATION 7 REGARDING THE IDENTIFICATION AND ASSISTANCE OF TRAFFICKED PERSONS [IN HUMAN 8 TRAFFICKING PREVENTION]. 9 (a) This section applies only to a physician who designates a direct patient care practice on an 10 application for renewal of a registration permit. 11 (b) A physician licensed under this subtitle who submits an 12 application for renewal of a registration permit [and who 13 14 designates a direct patient care practice] must complete at least one hour of continuing medical education under this section 15 regarding the identification and assistance of trafficked persons: 16 (1) in the first renewal period following the issuance 17 of the physician's initial registration permit under this chapter; 18 19 and (2) if the board approves more than one course under 20 21 Subsection (d), at least once in every third renewal period following the renewal period described by Subdivision (1) [, as part 22 23 of the hours of continuing medical education required for Section 156.051(a)(2), a human compliance with 24 trafficking

3	<u>(c)</u> [(b)] The <u>hours</u> [board shall designate the human

7	(2) may be counted toward the hours of [course for

21	(e) A physician may satisfy the requirement of Subsection
22	(b)(1) by completing at least one hour of a training course approved

26	(f) Notwithstanding Subsection (b), a physician who on
27	September 1, 2023, holds a license to practice medicine under this

subtitle shall complete at least one hour of continuing medical 1 2 education under this section regarding the identification and assistance of trafficked persons. This subsection expires January 3 4 1, 2024. SECTION 2. Section 156.060, Occupations Code, as amended by 5 6 this Act, applies only to an application for renewal of a registration permit to practice medicine submitted on or after the 7 effective date of this Act. A renewal application submitted before 8

9 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 10 the date the application was submitted, and the former law is 11 continued in effect for that purpose.

12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
