#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to supplemental appropriations and reductions in appropriations and giving direction and adjustment authority 3 regarding appropriations. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 ARTICLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS 6 SECTION 1.01. DEFINITION. In this Act, "ARPA fund" means 7 money received by this state from the Coronavirus State Fiscal 8 Recovery Fund (42 U.S.C. Section 802) established under the 9 American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Pub. L. No. 117-2) and deposited 10 to the credit of the Coronavirus Relief Fund No. 325. 11 ARTICLE 2. GENERAL GOVERNMENT 12 13 SECTION 2.01. EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM: IMPLEMENTING 14 PRIOR LEGISLATION. (a) The amount of \$165,600,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Employees Retirement System 15 16 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of implementing the provisions of Chapter 940 (S.B. 17 321), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021. 18 The appropriations made in this section are for the 19 (b) purpose of amortizing the Employees Retirement System Retirement 20 21 Program's unfunded actuarial liabilities not later than the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2054, consistent with Chapter 940 22

23 (S.B. 321), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021.

24 SECTION 2.02. EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM: UNFUNDED

1 ACTUARIAL LIABILITIES. The amount of \$1,000,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Employees 2 3 Retirement System for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of amortizing the 4 5 Employees Retirement System Retirement Program's unfunded 6 actuarial liabilities.

SECTION 2.03. COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS: 7 OPIOID 8 SETTLEMENT FUNDS. The amount of \$26,846,996.60 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the comptroller of public accounts 9 10 for immediate deposit to the opioid abatement trust fund pursuant to Section 403.507(b)(2), Government Code, from money obtained 11 under the statewide opioid settlement agreement in State of Texas 12 v. McKinsey & Company, Inc., United States, No. D-1-GN-21-000551 13 (98th Dist. Ct., Travis County, Tex., Feb. 4, 2021). 14

15 SECTION 2.04. FISCAL PROGRAMS - COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC 16 ACCOUNTS: TEXAS GUARANTEED TUITION PLAN. The amount of 17 \$243,800,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to Fiscal Programs - Comptroller of Public Accounts for the two-year 18 period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose 19 of paying contract obligations and program expenses for the 20 21 Guaranteed Tuition Plan/Texas Tomorrow Fund.

22 SECTION 2.05. COMPTROLLER OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS: DEFERRED 23 MAINTENANCE DEDICATION. Not later than August 31, 2023, the 24 comptroller of public accounts shall transfer the amount of 25 \$400,000,000 from the general revenue fund to the deferred 26 maintenance account number 5166 to be used for the purpose of 27 addressing future maintenance of state buildings as directed by the

1 legislature.

SECTION 2.06. FACILITIES COMMISSION: LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES 2 3 COMMISSION FACILITY. (a) The amount of \$210,000,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Facilities 4 5 Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of constructing a new facility to be 6 used by the Library and Archives Commission for records and archive 7 8 storage.

General Land Texas Facilities 9 (b) The Office, the 10 Commission, the Library and Archives Commission, and other necessary state agencies are directed to take all legal actions 11 necessary to sell the Library and Archives Commission facility and 12 adjacent state-owned land currently located on Shoal Creek in the 13 14 City of Austin, Texas ("the Shoal Creek facility"). The proceeds 15 from the sale of the Shoal Creek facility may be appropriated by a future legislature to defray costs of the construction of the new 16 17 facility described by Subsection (a) of this section.

Any additional full-time equivalent (FTE) employees the 18 (c) 19 Texas Facilities Commission may require to achieve the purpose for which the appropriation under Subsection (a) of this section was 20 made are reflected in the total number of full-time equivalent 21 22 (FTE) employees authorized for the commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 23 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023 (the General 24 Appropriations Act).

(d) The capital budget authority of the Texas Facilities
Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature,
Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is

1 increased by \$210,000,000 for the appropriation made under 2 Subsection (a) of this section.

3 (e) The capital budget authority of the Texas Facilities 4 Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular 5 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state 6 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 7 \$210,000,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of 8 this section.

SECTION 2.07. APPROPRIATION 9 REDUCTION: DEPARTMENT OF 10 INFORMATION RESOURCES. The unencumbered appropriations from the 11 ARPA fund and the related increase in capital budget authority made 12 to the Department of Information Resources by Section 25, Chapter 10 (S.B. 8), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 3rd Called Session, 2021 13 14 (the Supplemental Appropriations Act), for cybersecurity projects 15 are reduced by \$200,000,000.

SECTION 2.08. APPROPRIATION REDUCTION: PUBLIC 16 FINANCE 17 AUTHORITY. (a) The unencumbered appropriations from the general revenue fund to the Public Finance Authority made by Chapter 1053 18 19 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), for use during the state fiscal 20 biennium ending August 31, 2023, for bond debt service payments, 21 including appropriations subject to Rider 3, page I-52, Chapter 22 23 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 24 (the General Appropriations Act), to the bill pattern of the appropriations to the Public Finance Authority, are reduced by a 25 26 total of \$18,466,179.

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(b) The Public Finance Authority shall identify the

strategies and objectives out of which the reduction in
 appropriations described by Subsection (a) of this section are to
 be made and the amount of the reduction for each of those strategies
 and objectives.

5 SECTION 2.09. PUBLIC FINANCE AUTHORITY: CUSTOMER RATE RELIEF CHARGES RELATED TO WINTER STORM URI. Contingent on the 6 enactment of legislation by the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 7 8 2023, relating to the payment of gas customer rate relief charges imposed for costs related to Winter Storm Uri, the amount necessary 9 10 to implement the provisions of that legislation (estimated to be \$3,861,553,084) is appropriated from the general revenue fund to 11 the Public Finance Authority for the two-year period beginning on 12 the effective date of this Act for the purpose of making a grant to 13 14 the issuing financing entity created under Section 1232.1072, 15 Government Code, to be used to pay the aggregate customer rate relief charges authorized by Subchapter I, Chapter 104, Utilities 16 17 Code, on behalf of customers in lieu of monthly charges in order to assist with recovery from the impact of Winter Storm Uri. 18

SECTION 2.10. STATE PRESERVATION BOARD: ENDOWMENT FUND. 19 Contingent on the enactment of legislation by the 88th Legislature, 20 Regular Session, 2023, relating to the creation of an endowment 21 fund for the State Preservation Board to be held by the Texas 22 23 Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company, the amount of \$200,000,000 is 24 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the comptroller of public accounts for the period beginning on the effective date of 25 26 this Act and ending August 31, 2023, to be deposited before August 31, 2023, to the endowment fund for use by the State Preservation 27

1 Board for the purposes described by that legislation.

SECTION 2.11. STATE PRESERVATION BOARD: MAINTENANCE FOR 2 TEXAS STATE HISTORY MUSEUM. 3 (a) The amount of \$2,975,000 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the 4 State 5 Preservation Board for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the purpose of replacing the roof and 6 boiler system of the Texas State History Museum. 7

8 (b) The capital budget authority of the State Preservation 9 Board in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 10 Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is 11 increased by \$2,975,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection 12 (a) of this section.

(c) The capital budget authority of the State Preservation Board in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by \$2,975,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this section.

18 SECTION 2.12. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: FORT VELASCO 19 HISTORICAL SITE. The amount of \$500,000 is appropriated from the 20 general revenue fund to the Texas Historical Commission for the 21 two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the 22 purpose of making a grant for the maintenance and improvement of the 23 Fort Velasco Historic Site.

24 SECTION 2.13. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: ENDOWMENT FUND. 25 Contingent on the enactment of legislation by the 88th Legislature, 26 Regular Session, 2023, relating to the creation of an endowment 27 fund for the Texas Historical Commission to be held by the Texas

1 Treasury Safekeeping Trust Company, the amount of \$300,000,000 is 2 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the comptroller of 3 public accounts for the period beginning on the effective date of 4 this Act and ending August 31, 2023, to be deposited before August 5 31, 2023, to the endowment fund for use by the Texas Historical 6 Commission for the purposes described by that legislation.

TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: 7 SECTION 2.14. SAN JACINTO BATTLEGROUND STATE HISTORIC SITE. (a) The amount of \$102,700,000 8 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas 9 Historical Commission for the two-year period beginning on the 10 effective date of this Act for the purpose of restoring the San 11 Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site and making improvements to 12 the visitor center for the site. 13

(b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical
Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature,
Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is
increased by \$102,700,000 for the appropriation made under
Subsection (a) of this section.

(c) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by \$102,700,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this section.

25 SECTION 2.15. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: BATTLESHIP 26 TEXAS SITE RESTORATION. (a) The amount of \$40,000,000 is 27 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical

Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date
 of this Act for the purpose of restoring the Battleship Texas site,
 including demolishing the battleship's slip and accessory
 structures and restoring the historic appearance of the entire
 site.

6 (b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 7 Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 8 Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is 9 increased by \$40,000,000 for the appropriation made under 10 Subsection (a) of this section.

11 (c) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 12 Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular 13 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state 14 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 15 \$40,000,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this 16 section.

SECTION 2.16. 17 TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: OFFICE MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS. (a) The amount of \$327,000 18 is appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical 19 Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date 20 21 of this Act for the purpose of maintenance and repairs to the commission's complex in central Austin, Texas, including lead paint 22 23 abatement and window repairs.

(b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical
Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature,
Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is
increased by \$327,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection

1 (a) of this section.

2 SECTION 2.17. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: MAGOFFIN HOME 3 STATE HISTORIC SITE. (a) The amount of \$4,144,000 is appropriated 4 from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical Commission 5 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act 6 for the purpose of stabilizing and rebuilding the Magoffin Home in 7 the City of El Paso, Texas.

8 (b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 9 Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 10 Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is 11 increased by \$4,144,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection 12 (a) of this section.

13 (c) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 14 Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular 15 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state 16 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 17 \$4,144,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this 18 section.

SECTION 2.18. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: 19 VARNER-HOGG PLANTATION STATE HISTORIC SITE. (a) The amount of \$825,000 is 20 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical 21 Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date 22 23 of this Act for the purpose of remediating damage to the foundation 24 of Varner-Hogg Plantation structures caused by decades of flood events occurring at the plantation. 25

(b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical
27 Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature,

Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is
 increased by \$825,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection
 (a) of this section.

4 (c) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 5 Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular 6 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state 7 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 8 \$825,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this 9 section.

SECTION 2.19. TEXAS HISTORICAL COMMISSION: MAINTENANCE AT 10 VARIOUS STATE HISTORIC SITES. (a) The amount of \$2,875,000 is 11 12 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical Commission for the two-year period beginning on the effective date 13 14 of this Act for the purpose of undertaking maintenance projects at various state historic sites, which may include replacing roofs, 15 stabilizing ruins, replacing heating, ventilation, and air 16 17 conditioning (HVAC) systems, or other necessary maintenance 18 projects.

(b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is increased by \$2,875,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this section.

(a) The amount of \$7,500,000 is appropriated 23 from the general revenue fund to the Texas Historical Commission 24 for the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act 25 for the purpose of making updates and modifications to modernize 26 the George H. W. Bush Gallery and exhibits at the National Museum of 27 the Pacific War.

(b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is increased by \$3,401,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this section.

10 (b) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 11 Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, 12 Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is 13 increased by \$4,300,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection 14 (a) of this section.

15 (c) The capital budget authority of the Texas Historical 16 Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, Regular 17 Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the state 18 fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 19 \$4,300,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of this 20 section.

SECTION 3.01. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: 22 23 MEDICAID SHORTFALL. The amount of \$2,935,300,000 is appropriated 24 from the general revenue fund, and the amount of \$5,500,000,000 is appropriated from federal funds, to the Health and Human Services 25 26 Commission for the state fiscal year ending August 31, 2023, for the purpose of Medicaid client services under Goal A, Medicaid Client 27

Services, as listed in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th
 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations
 Act).

4 SECTION 3.02. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION: STATE 5 HOSPITALS AND CAPACITY. (a) The amount of \$2,321,000,000 is 6 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Health and Human 7 Services Commission for the two-year period beginning on the 8 effective date of this Act for the purpose of constructing state 9 hospitals and increasing inpatient capacity.

10 (b) The capital budget authority of the Health and Human 11 Services Commission in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th 12 Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations 13 Act), is increased by \$2,321,000,000 for the appropriation made 14 under Subsection (a) of this section.

15 (c) The capital budget authority of the Health and Human 16 Services Commission in H.B. 1, Acts of the 88th Legislature, 17 Regular Session, 2023 (the General Appropriations Act), for the 18 state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2023, is increased by 19 \$2,321,000,000 for the appropriation made under Subsection (a) of 20 this section.

21 SECTION 3.03. TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE 22 SERVICES: FOSTER CARE SHORTFALL. The amount of \$12,581,246 is 23 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Department 24 of Family and Protective Services for the state fiscal year ending 25 August 31, 2023, to address a budget shortfall associated with 26 Strategy B.1.9, Foster Care Payments, as listed in Chapter 1053 27 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the

1 General Appropriations Act).

2 SECTION 3.04. TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF FAMILY AND PROTECTIVE 3 SERVICES: INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY. (a) The amount of \$250,000 is 4 appropriated from the general revenue fund to the Texas Department 5 of Family and Protective Services for the two-year period beginning 6 on the effective date of this Act to pay for information technology 7 costs for the collection by children's advocacy centers of 8 information from state agencies.

9 The capital budget authority of the Texas Department of (b) 10 Family and Protective Services in Chapter 1053 (S.B. 1), Acts of the 11 87th Legislature, Regular Session, 2021 (the General Appropriations Act), is increased by \$250,000 for the appropriation 12 made under Subsection (a) of this section. 13

SECTION 3.05. DEPARTMENT 14 OF STATE HEALTH SERVICES: 15 FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS. The amount of \$25,000,000 is appropriated from the ARPA fund to the Department of State Health 16 17 Services for use during the two-year period beginning on the effective date of this Act for the Federally Qualified Health 18 19 Center Incubator Program.

ARTICLE 10. EFFECTIVE DATE

13 SECTION 10.01. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Subject to Subsections14 (b) and (c) of this section, this Act takes effect immediately.
