1 AN ACT 2 relating to the manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance or marihuana causing death or serious bodily injury; creating a 3 criminal offense; increasing a criminal penalty. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 481.122(c), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 8 (c) An offense under this section is a felony of the second 9 degree, except that the offense is a felony of the first degree if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the person to whom the 10 actor delivered the controlled substance or marihuana died or 11 suffered serious bodily injury as a result of injecting, ingesting, 12 inhaling, or introducing into the person's body any amount of the 13 14 controlled substance or marihuana manufactured or delivered by the actor, regardless of whether the controlled substance or marihuana 15 16 was used by itself or with another substance, including a drug, adulterant, or dilutant. 17 SECTION 2. Section 481.141, Health and Safety Code, 18 amended to read as follows: 19 20 Sec. 481.141. OFFENSE: MANUFACTURE OR DELIVERY OF 21 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE CAUSING DEATH OR SERIOUS BODILY INJURY. (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly manufactures or 22

- 5 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 6 an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 7 offense committed before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 8 by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, and the
- 9 former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of
- 10 this section, an offense was committed before the effective date of
- 11 this Act if any element of the offense occurred before that date.
- 12 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
