1-26 (k) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a 1-27 business owner or operator that does not require employees or 1-28 contractors of the business to be vaccinated against a pandemic 1-29 disease is not liable for injury or death caused by the exposure of 1-30 an individual to the pandemic disease through an employee or 1-31 contractor of the business.

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1-35 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-36 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-37 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 1-38 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 1-39 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
