5	SECTION 1. Chapter 42, Penal Code, is amended by adding
6	Section 42.074 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 42.074. UNLAWFUL DISCLOSURE OF RESIDENCE ADDRESS OR
8	TELEPHONE NUMBER. (a) A person commits an offense if the person
9	posts on a publicly accessible website the residence address or
10	telephone number of an individual with the intent to cause harm or a
11	threat of harm to the individual or a member of the individual's
12	family or household.
13	(b) An offense under this section is a Class B misdemeanor,
14	except that the offense is a Class A misdemeanor if the offense
15	results in the bodily injury of:
16	(1) the individual whose residence address or
17	telephone number was posted on a publicly accessible website; or
18	(2) a member of the individual's family or household.
19	(c) For purposes of Subsection (a), it is prima facie
20	evidence of the intent to cause harm or a threat of harm to an
21	individual whose residence address or telephone number was posted
22	on a publicly accessible website or to a member of the individual's
23	family or household if the actor:
24	(1) receives a written demand from the individual to

- 1 not disclose the address or telephone number for reasons of safety;
- 2 and
- 3 <u>(2) either:</u>
- 4 (A) fails to remove the address or telephone
- 5 number from the publicly accessible website within a period of 48
- 6 hours after receiving the demand; or
- 7 (B) reposts the address or telephone number on
- 8 the same or a different publicly accessible website, or makes the
- 9 information publicly available through another medium, within a
- 10 period of four years after receiving the demand.
- 11 (d) If conduct that constitutes an offense under this
- 12 section also constitutes an offense under Section 36.06(a-1), the
- 13 actor may be prosecuted under either section but not both.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
