## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to creating a temporary educator certification for certain
3	military service members.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.0444 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.0444. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION TO TEACH CAREER AND
8	TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION FOR CERTAIN MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS. (a)
9	This section applies to a person seeking certification to teach
10	career and technology education who:
11	(1) has served in the armed forces of the United
12	States; and
13	(2) was honorably discharged, retired, or released
14	from active duty.
15	(b) The board shall propose rules under this subchapter
16	providing for the issuance of a temporary certificate to teach
17	career and technology education to a person described by Subsection
18	(a) who meets all other eligibility requirements for standard
19	certification to teach career and technology education, except that
20	the person may substitute for a requirement that the person hold:
21	(1) an associate degree from an accredited institution
22	of higher education, 48 months of active duty military service
23	described by Subsection (a); or
24	(2) a bachelor's degree:

- 1 (A) the military service described by
- 2 Subdivision (1); and
- 3 (B) 60 semester credit hours completed at a
- 4 public or private institution of higher education with a minimum
- 5 grade point average of at least 2.50 on a four-point scale.
- 6 (c) Rules proposed by the board for a temporary certificate
- 7 issued under this section must provide that the certificate is:
- 8 (1) valid for no more than three years;
- 9 (2) limited to a one-time issuance; and
- 10 (3) not subject to renewal.
- 11 (d) A person issued a temporary certificate under this
- 12 section may be issued a standard certificate if the person
- 13 completes all eligibility requirements required for that
- 14 certification.
- 15 (e) A school district shall require a new employee who holds
- 16 <u>a temporary certificate issued under this section to obtain at</u>
- 17 least 20 hours of classroom management training, unless the new
- 18 employee has documented experience as an instructor or trainer
- 19 during the employee's required 48 months of active duty military
- 20 service.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 21.458, Education Code, is amended by
- 22 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-2) to read as
- 23 follows:
- 24 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), each [Each]
- 25 school district may assign a mentor teacher to each classroom
- 26 teacher who has less than two years of teaching experience in the
- 27 subject or grade level to which the teacher is assigned. A teacher

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- 1 assigned as a mentor must:
- 2 (1) to the extent practicable, teach in the same
- 3 school;
- 4 (2) to the extent practicable, teach the same subject
- 5 or grade level, as applicable; and
- 6 (3) meet the qualifications prescribed by
- 7 commissioner rules adopted under Subsection (b).
- 8 <u>(a-2)</u> A school district shall assign a mentor teacher to a
- 9 classroom teacher who has been issued a temporary certificate to
- 10 teach career and technology education under Section 21.0444 for at
- 11 least two school years.
- 12 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 13 of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 14 propose rules relating to temporary certificates to teach career
- 15 and technology education for certain military service members as
- 16 required by Section 21.0444, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 17 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
