AN ACT

2	relating to creating a temporary educator certification for certain
3	military service members.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 21.0444 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 21.0444. TEMPORARY CERTIFICATION FOR CERTAIN MILITARY
8	SERVICE MEMBERS. (a) This section applies to a person seeking
9	<pre>certification who:</pre>
10	(1) has served in the armed forces of the United
11	States; and
12	(2) was honorably discharged, retired, or released
13	<pre>from active duty.</pre>
14	(b) The board shall propose rules under this subchapter
15	providing for the issuance of a temporary certificate to a person
16	described by Subsection (a) who meets all other eligibility
17	requirements for certification, except that the person may
18	substitute for a requirement that the person hold:
19	(1) an associate degree from an accredited institution
20	of higher education, 48 months of active duty military service; or
21	(2) a bachelor's degree:
22	(A) the military service described by
23	Subdivision (1); and
24	(B) 60 semester credit hours completed at a

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- 1 public or private institution of higher education with a minimum
- 2 grade point average of at least 2.50 on a four-point scale.
- 3 (c) Rules proposed by the board for a temporary certificate
- 4 issued under this section must provide that the certificate is:
- 5 (1) valid for no more than five years;
- 6 (2) limited to a one-time issuance; and
- 7 <u>(3) not subject to renewal.</u>
- 8 <u>(d) A person issued a temporary certificate under this</u>
- 9 section may be issued a standard certificate if the person
- 10 completes all eligibility requirements required for that
- 11 certification.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 21.458, Education Code, is amended by
- 13 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-2) to read as
- 14 follows:
- 15 (a) Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), each [Each]
- 16 school district may assign a mentor teacher to each classroom
- 17 teacher who has less than two years of teaching experience in the
- 18 subject or grade level to which the teacher is assigned. A teacher
- 19 assigned as a mentor must:
- 20 (1) to the extent practicable, teach in the same
- 21 school;
- 22 (2) to the extent practicable, teach the same subject
- 23 or grade level, as applicable; and
- 24 (3) meet the qualifications prescribed by
- 25 commissioner rules adopted under Subsection (b).
- 26 (a-2) A school district shall assign a mentor teacher to a
- 27 classroom teacher who has been issued a temporary certificate under

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- 1 Section 21.0444 for at least two school years.
- 2 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 3 of this Act, the State Board for Educator Certification shall
- 4 propose rules relating to temporary educator certificates for
- 5 certain military service members as required by Section 21.0444,
- 6 Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
