- 4 (c) Before administering a student well-being questionnaire
- 5 or health screening form to a student in kindergarten through grade
- 6 <u>5, the school district must provide the questionnaire or health</u>
- 7 screening form to the parent and obtain the permission of the
- 8 parent.
- 9 (d) Each school district shall adopt procedures for a parent
- 10 to notify the principal, or his or her designee, regarding concerns
- 11 under this section at his or her student's school and the process
- 12 for resolving those concerns within 7 calendar days after
- 13 notification by the parent.
- 14 (1) At a minimum, the procedures must require that
- 15 within 30 days after notification by the parent that the concern
- 16 <u>remains</u> unresolved, the school district must either resolve the
- 17 concern or provide a statement of the reasons for not resolving the
- 18 concern.
- 19 (2) If a concern is not resolved by the school
- 20 district, a parent may:
- 21 (A) Request the Commissioner of Education to
- 22 appoint a special magistrate who is a member of the State Bar of
- 23 Texas in good standing and who has at least 5 years' experience in
- 24 administrative law. The special magistrate shall determine facts
- 25 relating to the dispute over the school district procedure or
- 26 practice, consider information provided by the school district, and
- 27 render a recommended decision for resolution to the State Board of

- 1 Education within 30 days after receipt of the request by the parent.
- 2 The State Board of Education must approve or reject the recommended
- 3 decision at its next regularly scheduled meeting that is more than 7
- 4 calendar days and no more than 30 days after the date the
- 5 recommended decision is transmitted. The costs of the special
- 6 magistrate shall be borne by the school district. The State Board
- 7 of Education shall adopt rules, including forms, necessary to
- 8 implement this subsection.
- 9 (B) Bring an action against the school district
- 10 to obtain a declaratory judgment that the school district procedure
- 11 or practice violates this section and seek injunctive relief. A
- 12 court may award damages and shall award reasonable attorney fees
- 13 and court costs to a parent who receives declaratory or injunctive
- 14 relief.
- 15 (3) Each school district shall adopt policies to
- 16 notify parents of the procedures required under this subsection.
- SECTION 2. By June 30, 2024, the Texas Education Agency
- 18 shall review and update, as necessary, school counseling frameworks
- 19 and standards; educator practices and professional conduct
- 20 principles; and any other student services personnel guidelines,
- 21 standards, or frameworks in accordance with the requirements of
- 22 this act.
- SECTION 3. Section 28.004, Education Code, is amended by
- 24 amending subsection (i-3) and adding subsection (i-4) to read as
- 25 follows:
- 26 (i-3) A school district may not adopt procedures or student
- 27 support forms that prohibit school district personnel from

- 1 notifying a parent about his or her student's mental, emotional, or
- 2 physical health or well-being, or a change in related services or
- 3 monitoring, or that encourage or have the effect of encouraging a
- 4 student to withhold from a parent such information. School
- 5 district personnel may not discourage or prohibit parental
- 6 notification of and involvement in critical decisions affecting a
- 7 student's mental, emotional, or physical health or well-being.
- 8 [Subsection (i-2) and this subsection expire August 1, 2024.]
- 9 (i-4) Classroom instruction by school personnel or third
- 10 parties on sexual orientation or gender identity may not occur in
- 11 kindergarten through grade 5 or in a manner that is not age
- 12 appropriate or developmentally appropriate for students in
- 13 accordance with state standards.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
