This Act may be cited as Alyssa's Law. SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 37, Education Code, is 6 7 amended by adding Section 37.117 to read as follows: Sec. 37.117. SILENT PANIC ALERT TECHNOLOGY. (a) Each 8 9 school district and open-enrollment charter school shall provide each classroom in the district or school with silent panic alert 10 technology that allows for immediate contact with district or 11 school emergency services and emergency services agencies, law 12 enforcement agencies, health departments, and fire departments. 13 14 (b) Silent panic alert technology provided by a school district or open-enrollment charter school under this section does 15 not satisfy the requirement under Section 37.108(a)(2) for the 16 district or school to ensure employees have classroom access to a 17 telephone or another electronic communication device. 18 (c) To comply with this section, a school district or 19 open-enrollment charter school may: 20 21 (1) use funds provided to the district or school through the school safety allotment under Section 48.115 or other 22 23 available funds; and 24 (2) use the district's or school's customary

2 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2025-2026 3 school year.

4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
