Section 1501.157(b), Insurance Code, is amended 16 to read as follows: 17 (b) Coverage of a newborn child of a covered employee under 18 this section ends on the 61st [32nd] day after the date of the 19 child's birth unless, not later than the 60th [31st] day after the 20 21 date of birth, the small employer health benefit plan issuer receives: 22 (1) notice of the birth; and 23 24 (2) any required additional premium.

Section 1501.607(b), Insurance Code, is amended 1 2 to read as follows: Coverage of a newborn child of a covered employee under 3 (b) this section ends on the 61st [32nd] day after the date of the 4 child's birth unless: 5 6 (1) children are eligible for coverage under the large 7 employer health benefit plan; and 8 (2) not later than the 60th [31st] day after the date of birth, the large employer health benefit plan issuer receives: 9 (A) notice of the birth; and 10 (B) any required additional premium. 11 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only 12 to a health benefit plan that is delivered, issued for delivery, or 13 renewed on or after January 1, 2024. A health benefit plan that is 14 15 delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2024, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 16 17 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose. 18 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023. 19

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
