## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the removal of restrictions on funding and payment of
- 3 costs for certain full-time online educational programs;
- 4 authorizing a fee.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 26.0031(c-1), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (c-1) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 9 may decline to pay the cost for a student of more than three
- 10 yearlong electronic courses, or the equivalent, during any school
- 11 year. This subsection does not:
- 12 (1) limit the ability of the student to enroll in
- 13 additional electronic courses at the student's cost; or
- 14 (2) apply to a student enrolled in a full-time online
- 15 program [that was operating on January 1, 2013].
- SECTION 2. Section 30A.153(a-1), Education Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (a-1) For purposes of Subsection (a), a school district or
- 19 open-enrollment charter school is limited to the funding described
- 20 by that subsection for a student's enrollment in not more than three
- 21 electronic courses during any school year, unless the student is
- 22 enrolled in a full-time online program [that was operating on
- 23 January 1, 2013].
- SECTION 3. Subchapter D, Chapter 30A, Education Code, is

- 1 amended by adding Section 30A.156 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 30A.156. PROGRAM ESTABLISHMENT FEE. (a) If the agency
- 3 determines that the cost of supporting the establishment of a
- 4 full-time online program, including the cost of evaluating and
- 5 approving electronic courses, will not be paid by the agency
- 6 because funds for that purpose are not available, a school district
- 7 or open-enrollment charter school that intends to operate a
- 8 full-time online program may pay to the agency a one-time fee in an
- 9 amount that is equal to the cost of establishing that program to
- 10 ensure adequate support for that program is provided.
- 11 (b) The agency shall develop and publish a fee schedule for
- 12 purposes of establishing a full-time online program.
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply to
- 14 electronic courses taken through the state virtual school network
- 15 beginning with the 2023-2024 school year.
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
