A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to prohibiting certain discrimination based on sexual
- 3 orientation or gender identity or expression.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Articles 42.014(a) and (c), Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) In the trial of an offense under Title 5, Penal Code, or
- 8 Section 28.02, 28.03, 28.08, or 42.0601, Penal Code, the judge
- 9 shall make an affirmative finding of fact and enter the affirmative
- 10 finding in the judgment of the case if at the guilt or innocence
- 11 phase of the trial, the judge or the jury, whichever is the trier of
- 12 fact, determines beyond a reasonable doubt that the defendant
- 13 intentionally selected the person against whom the offense was
- 14 committed, or intentionally selected the person's property that was
- 15 damaged or affected as a result of the offense, because of the
- 16 defendant's bias or prejudice against a group identified by race,
- 17 color, disability, religion, national origin or ancestry, age,
- 18 gender, [or] sexual orientation, or gender identity or expression
- 19 [preference] or by status as a peace officer or judge.
- 20 (c) In this article:
- 21 (1) "Gender identity or expression" means having or
- 22 being perceived as having a gender-related identity, appearance,
- 23 expression, or behavior, regardless of whether that identity,
- 24 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly

- 1 associated with the person's actual or perceived sex.
- 2 (2) "Sexual orientation" means the actual or perceived
- 3 status of an individual with respect to the individual's
- 4 sexuality[, "sexual preference" has the following meaning only: a
- 5 preference for heterosexuality, homosexuality, or bisexuality].
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 153.003, Family Code, is amended to read
- 7 as follows:
- 8 Sec. 153.003. NO DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEX, SEXUAL
- 9 ORIENTATION, GENDER IDENTITY OR EXPRESSION, OR MARITAL STATUS. (a)
- 10 The court shall consider the qualifications of the parties without
- 11 regard to their marital status, sexual orientation, or gender
- 12 identity or expression, or to the sex of the party or the child in
- 13 determining:
- 14 (1) which party to appoint as sole managing
- 15 conservator;
- 16 (2) whether to appoint a party as joint managing
- 17 conservator; and
- 18 (3) the terms and conditions of conservatorship and
- 19 possession of and access to the child.
- 20 (b) In this section:
- 21 (1) "Gender identity or expression" means having or
- 22 being perceived as having a gender-related identity, appearance,
- 23 expression, or behavior, regardless of whether that identity,
- 24 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly
- 25 associated with the person's actual or perceived sex.
- 26 (2) "Sexual orientation" means the actual or perceived
- 27 status of an individual with respect to the individual's sexuality.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 544.002, Insurance Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (d) to read as
- 3 follows:
- 4 (a) A person may not refuse to insure or provide coverage to
- 5 an individual, refuse to continue to insure or provide coverage to
- 6 an individual, limit the amount, extent, or kind of coverage
- 7 available for an individual, or charge an individual a rate that is
- 8 different from the rate charged to other individuals for the same
- 9 coverage because of the individual's:
- 10 (1) race, color, religion, or national origin;
- 11 (2) age, gender, marital status, or geographic
- 12 location; [or]
- 13 (3) disability or partial disability; or
- 14 (4) sexual orientation or gender identity or
- 15 <u>expression</u>.
- 16 <u>(d) In this section:</u>
- 17 (1) "Gender identity or expression" means having or
- 18 being perceived as having a gender-related identity, appearance,
- 19 expression, or behavior, regardless of whether that identity,
- 20 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly
- 21 associated with the person's actual or perceived sex.
- 22 (2) "Sexual orientation" means the actual or perceived
- 23 status of an individual with respect to the individual's sexuality.
- SECTION 4. Section 21.002, Labor Code, is amended by adding
- 25 Subdivisions (9-a) and (13-a) to read as follows:
- 26 (9-a) "Gender identity or expression" means having or
- 27 being perceived as having a gender-related identity, appearance,

- 1 expression, or behavior, regardless of whether that identity,
- 2 appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly
- 3 associated with the person's actual or perceived sex.
- 4 (13-a) "Sexual orientation" means the actual or
- 5 perceived status of an individual with respect to the individual's
- 6 sexuality.
- 7 SECTION 5. Section 21.051, Labor Code, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 Sec. 21.051. DISCRIMINATION BY EMPLOYER. An employer
- 10 commits an unlawful employment practice if because of race, color,
- 11 disability, religion, sex, national origin, [or] age, sexual
- 12 orientation, or gender identity or expression the employer:
- 13 (1) fails or refuses to hire an individual, discharges
- 14 an individual, or discriminates in any other manner against an
- 15 individual in connection with compensation or the terms,
- 16 conditions, or privileges of employment; or
- 17 (2) limits, segregates, or classifies an employee or
- 18 applicant for employment in a manner that would deprive or tend to
- 19 deprive an individual of any employment opportunity or adversely
- 20 affect in any other manner the status of an employee.
- 21 SECTION 6. Article 42.014, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 22 amended by this Act, applies only to an offense committed on or
- 23 after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before
- 24 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on
- 25 the date the offense was committed, and the former law is continued
- 26 in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense
- 27 was committed before the effective date of this Act if any element

- 1 of the offense occurred before that date.
- 2 SECTION 7. (a) Section 153.003, Family Code, as amended by
- 3 this Act, applies to a suit affecting the parent-child relationship
- 4 pending in a trial court on the effective date of this Act or filed
- 5 on or after that date.
- 6 (b) The enactment of this Act constitutes a material and
- 7 substantial change of circumstances sufficient to warrant
- 8 modification of a court order or portion of a decree that provides
- 9 for conservatorship or possession of or access to a child rendered
- 10 before the effective date of this Act.
- 11 SECTION 8. Section 544.002, Insurance Code, as amended by
- 12 this Act, applies only to a health benefit plan delivered, issued
- 13 for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2024. A health
- 14 benefit plan delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before
- 15 January 1, 2024, is governed by the law as it existed immediately
- 16 before the effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in
- 17 effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 9. Section 21.051, Labor Code, as amended by this
- 19 Act, applies to conduct occurring on or after the effective date of
- 20 this Act. Conduct occurring before the effective date of this Act
- 21 is governed by the law in effect on the date the conduct occurred,
- 22 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
