6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
7	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
8	amended by adding Section 38.0021 to read as follows:
9	Sec. 38.0021. FACE COVERING MANDATE PROHIBITED.
10	Notwithstanding any other law, a student in any grade level from
11	kindergarten through grade 12 may not be required to wear a face
12	mask or face covering to prevent the spread of an infectious disease
13	as a condition of the student's admission to, continued enrollment
14	in, or attendance at any public school in this state.
15	SECTION 2. Section 161.0085, Health and Safety Code, is
16	amended by adding Subsection (b-1) and amending Subsection (e) to
17	read as follows:
18	(b-1) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
19	may not require a student to provide any documentation certifying
20	the student's COVID-19 vaccination status or post-transmission
21	recovery to allow the student entry to, to gain access to, or to
22	receive educational services from the district or school.
23	(e) This section may not be construed to:

- 1 open-enrollment charter school from implementing COVID-19
- 2 screening and infection control protocols in accordance with state
- 3 and federal law to protect public health; or
- 4 (2) interfere with an individual's right to access the
- 5 individual's personal health information under federal law.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 7 school year.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
