## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the creation and maintenance by an appraisal district
- 3 of a publicly available Internet database of information regarding
- 4 protest hearings conducted by the appraisal review board

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 26.17(c), Tax Code, is amended to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (c) The database must provide a link to:
- 10 (1) the Internet website used by each taxing unit in
- 11 which the property is located to post the information described by
- 12 Section 26.18; and
- 13 (2) the Internet database created by the chief
- 14 appraiser under Section 41.13 that contains information regarding
- 15 protest hearings conducted by the appraisal review board
- 16 established for the appraisal district.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 41, Tax Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Section 41.13 to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 41.13. PROTEST HEARING DATABASE. (a) The chief
- 20 appraiser of each appraisal district shall create and maintain a
- 21 publicly available and searchable Internet database that contains
- 22 information regarding protest hearings conducted by the appraisal
- 23 review board established for the district.
- 24 (b) For each protest hearing conducted by the appraisal

- 1 review board, the database must contain:
- 2 (1) the name of each board member who attended the
- 3 hearing;
- 4 (2) the date and time of the hearing;
- 5 (3) the account number and category for the property
- 6 that was the subject of the hearing;
- 7 (4) the appraised value according to the appraisal
- 8 district and the property owner's asserted value of the property
- 9 that was the subject of the hearing; and
- 10 (5) the board's determination of the protest,
- 11 <u>including the board's determination of the value of the property if</u>
- 12 the hearing was to consider a protest regarding appraised value.
- 13 (c) The chief appraiser shall update the database not later
- 14 than October 1 of each year.
- 15 (d) The database may, but is not required to, include
- 16 information for protests relating to a tax year preceding the 2024
- 17 tax year.
- 18 SECTION 3. Not later than the effective date of this Act,
- 19 the chief appraiser of each appraisal district shall create and
- 20 make available to the public the Internet database required by
- 21 Section 41.13, Tax Code, as added by this Act.
- 22 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect January 1, 2024.
