A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of a work group to conduct a study on 3 the feasibility of implementing an acute psychiatric bed registry. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. (a) In this section: "Commission" means the Health and Human Services 6 (1)Commission. 7 (2) "Executive commissioner" means the 8 executive 9 commissioner of the commission. (3) "Inpatient mental health facility" has the meaning 10 11 assigned by Section 571.003, Health and Safety Code. 12 (b) The commission shall establish a work group to conduct a 13 study on the feasibility of implementing a statewide or regional 14 acute psychiatric bed registry to list available beds at inpatient mental health facilities for the inpatient psychiatric treatment of 15 certain individuals. 16 The work group consists of the following members 17 (c) appointed by the executive commissioner unless otherwise provided: 18 (1) one member with appropriate expertise appointed by 19 20 the governor; 21 (2) two members with appropriate expertise appointed 22 by the lieutenant governor; 23 (3) two members with appropriate expertise appointed 24 by the speaker of the house of representatives;

No. 803 1 (4) the chair of the Texas Hospital Association or the 2 chair's designee; 3 (5) the president of the Texas Medical Association or 4 the president's designee; 5 (6) the president of the Texas Nurses Association or 6 the president's designee; 7 two members who are experts in the field of (7)8 technology; 9 (8) one member who is a licensed psychiatrist; (9) 10 one member who is а licensed professional counselor, as defined by Section 503.002, Occupations Code; 11 one member who works in a substance use treatment 12 (10)facility; 13 14 (11)one member who is a representative of a hospital 15 located in a rural area of this state; 16 (12) one member who is a representative of a hospital 17 located in a county with a population of four million or more; (13) one member who is a representative of a hospital 18 located in an urban area of this state in a county with a population 19 of less than four million; 20 21 (14) one member who is a representative of a public hospital; 22 23 (15)one member who is a representative of a private 24 hospital; 25 (16)one member who is a statistician; 26 (17)one member who is a public health expert; and (18)

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any other member with appropriate expertise as

1 the executive commissioner determines necessary.

2 (d) The work group shall elect from among the membership a3 presiding officer.

4 (e) The work group shall meet periodically and at the call5 of the presiding officer.

6 (f) Not later than September 1, 2024, the commission shall 7 prepare and submit to each standing committee of the senate and 8 house of representatives having primary jurisdiction over mental 9 health a written report that summarizes the results of the study 10 conducted under this section. The report must:

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(1) evaluate the effect of bed registries;

12 (2) include recommendations for increasing public13 awareness of bed registries;

14 (3) include recommendations for leveraging financial 15 incentives and legislative, regulatory, or contractual mechanisms 16 to expedite the entry of data for bed registries;

17 (4) assess the effect of hospital reimbursements in18 increasing bed availability;

19 (5) evaluate psychiatric treatment capacity in20 relation to bed availability; and

21 (6) include any other information the commission 22 considers necessary.

23 (g) The work group is abolished and this section expires 24 September 1, 2025.

25 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date 26 of this Act, the applicable appointing authorities shall appoint 27 the members to the work group established by this Act.
